NEW BRUNSWICK.

Diphtheria is prevalent in Penobscot, K. Co. Diphtheria is prevailing to an alarming extent in Cambridge, Queen's County. Several deaths have occurred.

The Monday Times and Judge Duford had a narrow escape from choking to death on Thursday while at dinner.
