Mr. Waddell, landlady of the hotel, accompanied by Mr. Waddell, a house of law, on his way down Whittlock street, inquired of him what he was going to do with the hotel, and he replied, "You will know to-morrow morning." On arriving at the town Whittlock street, inquired of what Waddell's business to St. Andrews was, and he replied, "I am going to set fire to the American House." Whittlock, who was a friend of his, urged him to come back with him to St. Andrews, where Waddell drew a revolver and threatened Whittlock. On arriving at the corner of the street leading to the hotel Whittlock, Waddell was flourishing his revolver. Whittlock, fearing for his own safety, having got Waddell to the carriage, drove off on his way out of town. He called John Brock, and told him that Waddell had set fire to the American House and was on his way to St. Andrews. Brock, who had been dressed as quickly as possible, but he got down town the fire had been discovered. The preliminary examination of Waddell will be held at the St. Andrews before Justice Hathaway, when the facts will be developed. Whittlock made his statement on oath at St. John yesterday. —*Globe* 16th.

## NOVA SCOTIA.

Yarmouth is about to erect a large brick building for the manufacture of cotton goods.

A man named Christian fell from the bow of a schooner in Halifax Harbor, and was drowned.

Three hundred and seventy-five quintals of codfish are landed at Lunenburg last week by eleven of the best boats of that port.

A wing has just been added to the woolen factory at Yarmouth, and 100 hands are now employed. Most of the products of the factory are contracted for in Montreal.

The Richmond Refinery is now working at the greatest capacity, there being one hundred and thirty hands employed in the refinery and coopers department. Last month more than thirteen thousand barrels were manufactured.

The gold fever at Bridgewater is at its height. Claims are daily being taken up in great numbers. The Government surveyors have been down and located lines and claims. The quartz taken from some of the claims is remarkably rich.

A man named Hobbs Row was instantly killed in the gold mines at Isaac's Harbor, N. S., on Wednesday. He was carrying a mine cart, and approached a vicinity where a blast was being fired by another party, when the explosion occurred, resulting fatally.

The prospectus is published in the Halifax papers of "The Halifax Steam Navigation Company," limited, capital \$300,000 in \$100 shares. The object of the company is to establish direct communication with Great Britain and from Halifax across the St. John. The company proposes to take advantage of the Dominion subsidy of \$25,000.

Nova Scotia enjoys the honor of having the first railroad constructed in America, and the oldest working locomotive and the oldest driver in the world. These three relics of the past, all still in working order, are employed at the Albion Mines to convey coal from Seaboard to the mines. The engine, a six wheeled engine named the "Samson," was sent on to the Chicago Railway exhibition in charge of its old driver, Mr. George Davidson, who assisted in its construction and came out to this country with it in 1838. He and his engine have been in active service for forty-five years, and both are far from past service yet. The Chicago Inter-Ocean devotes a large part of a column to the engine, driver and railway, and gives a description of the opening of this, the first railroad in North America.

## A TERRIBLE CALAMITY!

All amendments to the 6th clause (which repeals the bill) were rejected. The reading of the bill has been concluded by the committee.

The Government has resolved to purchase six railways, including the Great Northern, Great Eastern and Hamburg routes. The estimated cost is \$25,000,000, marks for which special arrangements will be made. The possession of these roads will enable the Government to control the whole system of railways in the Kingdom.

Rome, June 15.—A treaty of commerce between England and Italy has been signed.

CARRERA, June 17.—Fighting has occurred daily in Albania since the 12th and other tribes are expected to join the revolt. Montenegro has established a cordon on her frontier to prevent the Bulgarians from entering her territory.

SCUTARI, June 19.—An official report states that

the revolt of the Albanian tribes has been suppressed and the Albanians are asking for amnesty.

June 17.—Advices from Sierra Leone, state, that Chief Fofor has again made a raid upon the British settlement in Sherbro and that a British expedition was sent out against him in consequence, which succeeded in capturing and burning four more of his stockade towns, including one which was Garrisoned by 1,500 warriors.

DURBAN, June 15.—A missionary named Schroder has been murdered in Zululand.

John William Gurney, Bishop of Natal, died.

LIMA, June 15.—The following particulars relative to the terms of peace have been published in papers here, and were taken from letters stolen on the 24th inst. from a special courier en route to Gen. Iglesias: Chili will not forfeit the deserted and guano and saltpetre issued on February 9th, 1,000,000 tons, deducting a bonus, will be equally divided between the Chilean and Peruvian bidders. These profits only come out of the Peruvian Islands now worked. As future mines are found in annexed territories they belong exclusively to Chili, who can dispose of such newly discovered mines as it may desire. Chili does not hold itself responsible for any indebtedness of Peru. Chili holds the sovereignty of Locos Islands until sufficient guano is extracted to fulfil the sale of 1,000,000 tons. When the Peruvian Islands are sold, the sale of the islands is to be made in the form of a loan, the interest to be paid in guano, the commercial relations and indemnities to Chilean citizens will be discussed afterwards.

## UNITED STATES.

St. JOSEPH, Mo., June 17.—Heavy rains yesterday and to-night have done a great amount of damage to railroad tracks in this vicinity and communication by rail is cut off in all directions, except by the Kanab and the Santa Fe. The Santa Fe and only road running trains. The St. Joseph and Western has suffered most, some forty bridges being washed away. The Kansas City and St. Joseph and Council Bluffs is badly washed, and no trains by the Washah have come into this city since last Friday. All the other roads suffered considerably.

WILLIAMSBURG, Pa., June 17.—A violent storm and whirlwind visited Muncy this evening. The Philadelphia & Reading railroad station and half a mile of track were destroyed. A boy aged 13 was killed. Telegraphic communication with Muncy is entirely cut off and no further parties have been received here.

STATION, Oregon, June 19.—A fire destroyed the greater portion of this town last night. Loss \$100,000.

PAINECROSS, Mo., June 19.—While a public sale was in progress at the residence of R. S. Light, near Ravenna, on Saturday, a heavy thunder storm came up, and the men took refuge in a large barn. The barn was struck by lightning and three men killed.

STANLEYVILLE, Cal., June 19.—The Milton Hydraulic Mining Co.'s reservoir, containing 650,000 cubic feet of water, burst yesterday afternoon. The rush of water was irresistible and swept away everything from its path. It raised the level of Zaba river one hundred feet. The roar of rushing water was heard several miles away. It carried away all the bridges. Several lives are reported lost. Loss to reservoir \$75,000.

Twelve lives are reported lost by the flood at Seneca, Kansas, on Sunday. The rivers rose all night, and are now at a standstill.

The Star Route mail was not delivered at Fayette, Mo., in an old hot air balloon, which burst when it had attained a height of 2,000 feet. The balloon and aeronaut came down with a crash and plunged into a creek and disappeared. Stewarts' body was recovered.
