TOPICAL TREATMENT.

Connecting Link.—The Galatian church, founded by Paul A. D. 51, were visited by certain Jewish Christians, who said that they must conform to Jewish rites and customs to be saved, and undervalued the influence and relation of Paul. He wrote this Epistle to counteract their influence.

I. Bondage. In his discussion of the relations existing between the Christian and the Jewish believers, Paul compares the condition of the latter to that of a minor child, one who, though he may be the prospective heir of great possessions, is yet, for a time, restrained from the enjoyment of them. He is under the care of tutors, guardians and overseers, to whom he must render obedience, as if he were a slave and had no such expectations; by them he must be trained and disciplined, in order that he may be prepared for the right exercise of his powers and privileges, when he shall come into the full enjoyment of them. He is, for the time, in the condition of a servant. Like this was the condition of the Jews, and in fact, of all other people, before the coming of Christ. The Law was to train them to the place and relation of holiness. I pleaded and wrestled with him; and praise to his name! after six long years I found what I had long so earnestly sought. It was on the 23rd of April, 1822, when I was on a visit to Haddam, in Connecticut. Memorable day! The time and place will never be forgotten. I repeat it at this moment with thankfulness and joy. For then through the great love and power of our Lord my feet were set in a large place. I cannot give you the particulars better than by making an extract from my journal. "For some days I have been desirous to visit some friends, who are distinguished for piety and remarkable for the happiness which they enjoy in religion. It was my hope, that by associating with them, and through the help of their prayers, I might find the Lord more graciously near to my soul. After my visit to the place, and relation of holiness.
