Where the Day is Born.

The maritime powers of the world have agreed to make London the time centre, and the one hundred and eigh-(or Greenwich) as the point where the day changes. This meridian, therethe beginning of a new day for the earth; here to-day becomes to morrow.

It is here, then, that Sunday is born, just to the west of Honolulu. But bear in mind that the day travels westward. Therefore, this new-born day does not visit Honolulu until it has made the circuit of the globe. Honolulu and New Zsaland are only about thirty degrees apart in longitude; but they are a whole day apart as regards any particular day, because the point at which the day changes lies between them. Sunday born on the one hundred and eightieth meridian is a to the east of the line, and Sunday A collision by which two persons (near 1 A.
