The Mexican government have granted extraordinary concessions to a real estate company to induce immigration to eleven states in Mexico. The company have obtained a title to 55,000,000 acres of land in Chihuahua, Sinaloa, Durango, Cahuila, Zacatecas, Guanajuato, Tamaulipas, Vera, Cruz, Nichaveau, Galisco and Guerrero, and propose establishing agencies in all large cities in Europe and America.
