





WHAT GOD DID TO SAVE THE less: in spite of all the people's sins and although God sent the punishment. The Lord raised up judges : in various ways, by various means. The term Judges, which occurs here for the first time, does not signify a mere judicial officer. It is used for who, by the inspiration of the spirit of God, combined with great naturcontrol, and aroused them to throw off the yoke of oppression. The nation had no fixed capital, and the judge selected his own place of residence. They received no salary, imposed no tributes, made no laws, but merely exercised, for the deliver-
