INTERNATIONAL LESSON.

Second Quarter-Lesson V.—May 4.
THE RULER'S DAUGHTER.
—Luke 8:41, 42, 49, 56.

GOLDEN TEXT.—*Fear not; believe only, and she shall be made whole.*—Luke 8:56.

THE GREAT TROUBLE; THE DYING GIRL.—Vers. 41, 42. *And behold there came: to Matthew's house in Capernaum, where Jesus and his disciples had been invited. A man named Jairus, and he was a ruler of the synagogue: in Capernaum, and where this ruler must have heard Jesus preach. A ruler of the synagogue: one of the presiding officers. And he fell down at Jesus' feet. With Oriental facility, he would drop upon his knees, and bring his forehead to the ground at the feet of Jesus. And besought him that he would come into his house, for he had one only daughter. . . . and she lay dying. The light of his house was going out. Everything had been tried, and had failed. He had come to his last resource.*

JESUS GOES TO THEIR AID.—Ver. 42. *As he went the people thronged him. The disciples went with Jesus and probably the guests at the feast, many others knowing of Jairus' appeal, would follow to see what He would do.*

FAITH'S HARDEST TEST.—Vers. 49, 50. *There cometh one . . . saying to him, Thy daughter is dead; trouble not the Master. This was a new trial of Jairus' faith. While Jesus had been delaying with the sick by the way, his daughter had died. But when Jesus heard it, he answered, saying, Fear not, believe only. Believe only and she shall be made whole. There was no limit to Christ's power; the only danger was that Jairus' faith should fail. And when he came into the house, he suffered no man to go in: to the apartment where the dead child lay. Save Peter, and James, and John. It was necessary that they should be present, in order that they might be able afterward to testify to what was done. The father and the mother. Two classes alone were admitted,—those who, like Peter, etc., lived the life of courage and love; and they who, like the parents, had had the film removed from their eyes of grief. And all wept, and bewailed her. In the room were the minstrels and professional mourners with the servants, neighbors, and relations, making a great noise and tumult, according to the Oriental fashion. But he said, Weep not; she is not dead, but sleepeth. That he meant this figuratively is scarcely to be doubted from the whole spirit of the narrative. And they laughed him to scorn: they were so sure that the girl was really dead; and they did not perceive that Jesus was speaking figuratively. And he put them all out: with the multitude whom he would not permit to enter. And took her by the hand. Jesus usually touched those he healed, to show that the power came from him. And called, saying, Maid, arise. And her spirit came again: into the tabernacle of the flesh which it had left. And she arose straightway. Not only was she restored to life, but she was also cured of the deadly disease. Commanded to give her meat: food, which she would require after the long fasting occasioned by her disease. And her parents were astonished. This was no mark of a want of faith. There are some things that are always astonishing, no matter how certain we may be of their occurrence. But he charged them that they should tell no man. There were some peculiar reasons for this command, in the circumstances, of which we know nothing. To great notoriety might have interfered with the spiritual work of Jesus, by calling him away from his teaching to every dying bed. It might have excited a tumult from the people's trying to make him a temporal king in accordance with their ideas of the Messiah, which would have hindered the true kingdom.*
