Temperance Education.

The preventive work for temperance now going on in the United States, known as temperance education in the public schools, is rising In 1887 this instruction concerning the nature and effects of alcoholic liquors, and other narcotics, was introduced into the schools of Honolulu, Sandwich Islands. In the following year one of the American text-books on the topic was trans lated into Japanese, and is now in use in the schools of that country. In Australia temperance education is made compulsory in primary

The Siamese minister of education has recommended the translation and introduction of one of the American temperance physiologies into the government schools of that country, where not only alcohol and tobacco, but opium and Indian hemp as well, have united in their work of extermination. A resident missionary of Siam, writing to Mrs. Mary H. Hunt, the originator and leader of the temperance education movement in the schools of this country, and now superintendent of the last plague. 
