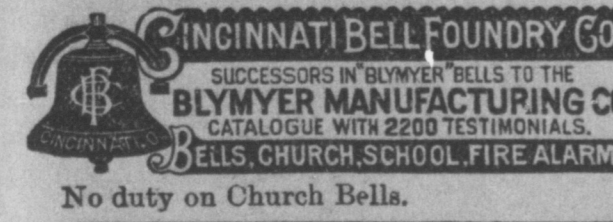

The Sabbath School.

INTERNATIONAL LESSON.

First Quarter-Lesson II. - Jan. 10.

A SONG OF SALVATION. - Isa. 26:1-10.

GOLDEN TEXT. - Trust ye in the Lord forever: for in the Lord Jehovah is everlasting strength. - Isa. 26:4. The prophet seems to stand upon a mountain ridge and look both backward and forward. He sees a some great deliverance. Perhaps, in vision, the deliverance was from exile in Babylon. This was the culmination of many deliverances, and the type of those to come. Through this the prophet looks forward. He sees in his vision the final triumph of God's kingdom, and has a glimpse of the New Jerusalem. In the midst of this vision he bursts out into this song of salvation, putting it in the mouths of the people as the one appropriate for them to sing.

PRaise FOR THE FINAL TRIUMPH OF GOD'S PEOPLE. THE CITY OF GOD. - Vers. 1-4. In that day, the day of deliverance and final triumph. Shall this song be sung in the land of Judah: where the triumph took place. This was the type in those days of the kingdom of God, the reign of the Messiah. We have a strong city. For the Jews, then, Jerusalem. For us, the New Jerusalem, a safe abiding under the shadow of the Almighty, "As the shadow of a great rock in a weary land." Salvation will God appoint for walls and bulwarks. The nation glories in freedom and safety, assured by God, and the guarantee of continued spiritual blessedness. God is our salvation in two ways, (1) by what he does for us. All his wisdom and power are pledged for the defence of his people. (2) By what he does within us. Open ye the gates. These verses remind us of the description of the New Jerusalem in Rev. 21. There are twelve gates to the city, four on each side, as if to express the welcome, and that all kinds of true Christians, from all races, may enter, each from his own direction, north, east, south or west. That the righteous nation which keepeth the truth may enter in. This is not contrary to the promise that whosoever believeth on Jesus shall be saved, and that we must enter into his kingdom by faith. For faith is the way by which we become righteous; all true faith leads to righteousness. Jesus saves from sin, not in sin. Jesus implants a new life, a new heart, a loving, obedient spirit, which makes the keeping of the commandments as natural as for a peach-tree to bear peaches, or a rose-tree roses. To enter into the heavenly state, to be filled with the heavenly spirit, to live according to the commandments, this is to enter the gates of that blessed city. Thou wilt keep, &c. God is the source of good. He keeps, he defends. Peace includes (1) Peace with God. (2) With heaven, harmony and sympathy with all that is there. (3) With nature; a harmony with all its laws. (4) With self; all the faculties working harmoniously. (5) With men. (6) Of an approving conscience. (7) Of a submissive will. (8) That comes from victory. (9) Which is eternal, unbroken. Whose mind is stayed on thee. The mind must be stayed, firmly settled on God, to bring peace. Trust ye in the Lord forever. Not in men, not in your own wisdom, but in God. Why? For in the Lord Jehovah is everlasting strength. A certain refuge throughout all eternity. God is a fortress that no enemy can scale, no length of time can weaken. He is a sure defence from all trouble from all sin, from all punishment of sin.

THE DESTRUCTION OF GOD'S ENEMIES - Vers. 5, 6. For he bringeth down them that dwell on high. As Nineveh or Babylon, both these great enemies of Judah were brought low. These cities are a type of the strongholds of the enemies of God in the world. Despotisms, oppressions, the liquor traffic, governmental corruption, infidelity, every form of evil defy the true God; but every one shall be brought low. The foot shall tread it down, even the feet of the poor, and the steps of the needy, i. e., of God's people. The weakest and poorest of God's people can overcome their strongest enemies. Those now oppressed and weak shall triumph over their oppressors. THE EFFECT OF GOD'S DEALINGS. - Vers. 7-10. The way of the just is uprightness. Or, a right way. He walks, in intention, along the straight way of truth. Thou, most upright (i. e., God), dost weigh (or direct) the path of the just. He weighs (or ponders) the path, with a view to keeping it straight and level, none, therefore, need turn aside from that well-constructed road into crooked ways of their own devising. Yea, in the way of thy judgments, O Lord, have we waited for thee, i. e., to see thee come forth as a judge, for the vindication of the people and the destruction of their enemies. The desire of our soul is to thy name. God's name

expresses the whole character and nature of God. It is the word used by the prophets when they would represent the personal presence of God. Religion consists much in holy desire. Desire is love on the wing; delight is love at rest. Real desires govern our conduct. It is useless to pretend that we thirst for grace, if by devout prayer and holy resolve we do not let down the bucket into the well. And to the remembrance (in memorial) of thee. The memorial is God's character expressed in his deeds of the past, his aid to his people, his deliverance of them, and all his actions wherein he has shown his righteousness, love and power. With my soul (truly, and not in form merely) have I desired thee in the night. The night of affliction, of sickness, persecution, oppression, disappointed hopes, spiritual darkness, the night of death. We are so sinful that it often requires something that makes us feel our weakness, or sin, or our need, to fix our desires on God. Will I seek thee early, i. e., diligently. For when thy judgments are in the earth, the inhabitants of the world will learn righteousness. By the long judgment of the exile the Jews learned lessons they never forgot. It was a new era in their history. They never again relapsed into idolatry.

God's Discipline. The object of God's discipline - sorrows and sickness he sends, the burdens he lays on them, the hard work he gives, the temptations he permits - is to make men righteous, and to lead higher degrees of goodness. (1) Those judgments which lead men to realize how weak and helpless they are, lead men to God as their only help and refuge. (2) God's judgments show his holy character, and hatred of sin, and so put a Cain-mark on sin to make men avoid it. (3) They are one means of bringing us into communion with God. Working with God, rejoicing in his good gifts, and prayer to him in the hour of need, all bring us into closer communion with our Heavenly Father. (4) God's discipline tends to develop character. Let favour be showed to the wicked, etc. God's judgments upon the wicked are necessary, because they will not be led to repentance by his goodness. In the land of uprightness. God's holy and redeemed land, where the people are all upright. Will he deal unjustly. A villain placed in such a country, will nevertheless act as a scoundrel. And will not behold the majesty of the Lord. God's goodness in nature, his holiness in his providence, rewarding goodness and punishing sin; all his wondrous works for his people, and his terrible judgments on the wicked; even the manifestation of God in his Son Jesus Christ, have no more effect on the wilfully wicked than a lovely landscape upon a blind man.

PRACTICAL HINTS. Praise, in word and deed, should be continually expressed for God's continual blessings. Have not bright, praising Christians led the church's van? God's kingdom is a city defended by his promises and loving care, and filled with all good things for his people. Only the righteous can enter this city. But all are welcome who are willing to trust and obey Jesus. The gates are open to all quarters of the world. Peace comes from faith in God, and in proportion to faith. There is no other source of true peace. God's judgments are upon the wicked. Wickedness is the sure road to destruction. The judgments are intended to lead men to trust in God, and learn righteousness.

OUR MOTTO. - If God be for us, who can be against us.

On Wednesday evening, the teachers of the York County Institute were entertained by the W. C. T. U. The meeting opened with the singing of the temperance anthem, For God and Home and Native Land. Reading of the Crusade Psalm (146) by the president, and prayer. Mrs. Phillips, superintendent of scientific temperance instruction, read several extracts from the National report of the same and in some very earnest remarks, urged the importance of such instruction being given in the public schools, and expressed the hope that at an early day, the board of Education would make scientific temperance instruction compulsory in the schools. Song by Miss Elith Porter; address by Rev. Mr. Weddall; song by Mr. Creadson; address by Dr. Inch, Superintendent of Board of Education, singing, refreshments, coffee, cake, etc. The thanks of the institute were then presented by Mr. E. Everitt, and the meeting closed with the singing of "God Save the Queen."

To be Successful Workers for the W. C. T. U.

Firstly, Our women must be interested in the Temperance Cause: Secondly, they must be women of faith and prayer, asking God for words of wisdom, as they have not only to reach the purse, but the heart and conscience, and to enlist the sympathy of others in this great and good work.

Thirdly, they must be cheerful; the Lord loveth a cheerful giver of strength and time, as well as of money. No call ought to be made without an honest effort to interest others.

The W. C. T. U., had its birth in prayer: it is an organization of mothers and sisters breathing the prayer of love and self-sacrifice: "For God, and Home and Humanity." What we aim at - what we pray for - what we hope for - is the prohibition of the liquor traffic in our Dominion. The education of children in temperance principles is now our chief work. Bands of Hope are organized by all our Unions. The Divine command is "Have no fellowship with the unfruitful works of darkness, but rather reprove them." - Eph. v. 11. "For it is the will of God that with well-doing ye put to silence the ignorance of foolish men." - 1 Peter ii, 15. Our dependence of success is wholly on God. We must continue the work in the name of Christ with sustained confidence that God will bless our labors. Let each Temperance worker ask herself the question, "Lord, what wilt Thou have me to do." Much of our work must be done by means of leaflets, newspaper articles and other such individual efforts. Though many are convinced of the evil nature of alcohol, the majority of people are yet very ignorant of its baneful effects on the human system.

Realizing that no drunkard can enter into the Kingdom of Heaven, do you wonder that the women of our land can no longer hold their peace.

The graves of millions, whose souls have been lost through strong drink, make a mute appeal for the overthrow of the liquor traffic.

"Then spake the Lord to Paul in the night by a vision, Be not afraid, but speak, and hold thy peace." - Woman's Journal.

One Decalogue.

We have taught men to be brave and women to be chaste. Mrs. Maggie P. Platt, in a spirit-ed address to the Good Templars, told them that it was not public sentiment, not education, not political parties, but backbone, which was needed to fight the liquor traffic. "It is backbone," she said, "which will make men go to the polls and vote for the total overthrow of the liquor interests. I do not believe in any check rein, but a clean sweep of the whole business, and this can only be accomplished by plenty of backbone."

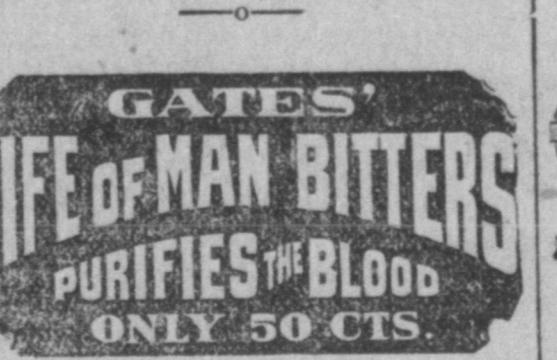
