New Brunswick

It is stated that the Malto Peptonized Porter Company, Limited, of Truro, are about to enter an action against the Moncton, N. B., division of Sons of Temperance on account of resolutions passed by the division stating that their preparation was "calculated to help the brewers do under the disguise of medicine what they have failed to do under the Scott Act," and requesting members to do all in their power to prohibit the sale of such Malto Peptonized Porter.

A boy named Thibideau, fourteen years of age, was killed on the Buctouche and Moncton railway, at McDougall Settlement last Wednesday. He fell from the top of a loaded car that was being moved at a siding, one leg being cut off and the body badly bruised.

At Dundas, Kent county, on Saturday, the barn of William Scribner was burned with all its contents. A horse, the property of Jacob VanBuskirk, was burned. The barn was insured for \$900.

On Sunday John A. Besty, Hillsboro, while under the influence of liquor, attempted to poison himself. Dr. Lewis was sent for, administered an emetic, at latest accounts he was improving.

Nova Scotia.

Fred Rinaud charged with wrecking a train in Dartmouth, was being committed to trial. Gillies, conservative, was elected in Richmond N. S. on Thursday, by about 3000 majority. William Ford for the past forty years clerk to the Municipality of Queens Co., N. S., died suddenly at Liverpool last week.

James McShane was re-elected mayor of Montreal.

A sad accident occurred at Ramer, Nfld., Sunday morning. Two boys, sons of Robert Evis, were on a pond. One fell in; the other ran and called his mother who, in trying to save her son, fell in, and both were drowned.

United States.

Chicago has been selected as the place for the National Democratic convention.

Fire broke out Thursday morning on the Nova Scotia ship Lydia, lying at Bayonne, N. J. She is laden with 35,000 barrels of crude oil for exportation. The fire started in the cabin and burned fiercely. The fire was extinguished before any great loss was done.

A terrific explosion of natural gas occurred at Lancaster, Ohio, Monday, by which a fine residence was destroyed, two churches partially demolished, about 50 houses damaged, and the family of Judge John S. Brasse had a marvellous escape from death or serious injury. The house, a large brick structure, was completely demolished, and the occupants hurled hundreds of feet. None of them were seriously injured. The loss is heavy.

New York had an \$800,000 fire Thursday.

A Texas despatch says the whole of the Rio Grande frontier is covered with snow. The suffering among the poorer classes of Mexicans and among United States troops in the field has been intense.

In Mobile, Ala., Harry Hinton, a negro implicated in the murder of the McMillan family was taken from jail by a mob, and hanged.

Mrs. Frederick L. Olsen and her two-year old child were burned to death Wednesday night in their home, in Chicago. Her three-year-old boy was also burned severely.

A blizzard of unprecedented severity passed over Northwest Texas last week. Cattle were frozen.

A mob of 250 men took from the jail in Nevada, Mo., Heplar, the murderer of Mrs. Goodly and her little son, and hanged him.

Advices from Durango, the centre of the death-stricken region of Mexico, say it has been raining there steadily for two days. This is the first rain-fall in that vicinity in four years.

Other Provinces.

Mr. Burdett, Liberal M. P., for East Hastings, Ont., aged 49, died Wednesday afternoon of consumption.

The Rustico P. E. I. Bank, the smallest bank in the world has made an assignment.

At Petrolia, Ont., Mrs. Dongan an old lady, was frozen to death Wednesday night.

Jan. 21.—Three boys, aged 7, 9, and 11 years, sons of Chas. Collins, while playing on the ice at La Poile, Nfld. broke through. The two youngest were drowned and the other rescued with difficulty.

An experiment is being made in shipping fresh salmon from the Pacific coast to Europe. If it be successful fresh salmon will be shipped hereafter instead of canned salmon. Thirty thousand pounds of fresh salmon were shipped in a car from the Fraser River last week, going by way of the Canadian Pacific to New York, and thence, in the cold storage room of a German steamship, to Hamburg.

The investigation of serious charges brought against Commissioner Herchmer of the Northwest mounted police commenced yesterday. Included among the charges, which are 137 in number, are suborning of testimony, false representations to the department, unjust treatment of men, improper sentences and irregularities in management.

Montreal had slight fires between 9 p. m. Wednesday and 7 a. m. Thursday. The total loss is estimated at \$300,000, chiefly covered by insurance. A number of houses were burned. Mills & McDougall, wollen merchants; and Leonard Bros. fish dealers, were the chief sufferers.

The Rustico (P. E. I.) bank authorities have issued a notice warning the public against exchanging their bank notes at a discount, as face value will be given for them at the bank.

In Toledo, Ohio, Tuesday, fire destroyed the Robinson electric street railway works, a huge brick structure containing thirty-five electric motor cars. The loss is estimated at \$100,000.

British and Foreign.

In Liverpool, Friday, William Jones a well known cotton broker, committed suicide by jumping from the upper window of his residence.

At Nottingham, Eng., a widow named Castings murdered her two children and then committed suicide.

Archduke Francis Ferdinand, heir to the Austrian throne, is ill. He is 29 years old and unmarried.

In Berlin, Wednesday, Johann Biederman, a prominent and wealthy physician, 42 years of age, shot and killed his affianced bride, aged 18, and then took his own life; jealousy was the cause.

The male inhabitants of Chelabinsk, Russia, are leaving by hundreds to avoid seeing their families starve to death. Unburied carcasses of horses and cattle lie in every direction together with human bodies. The only food left is dry mixed herbs. A traveller from that locality says hardly anybody appeared to have partaken of food for three days before his visit and all were expecting death. The whole village took the last sacrament together.

Several quite severe shocks of earthquake were felt in Rome Friday, causing a slight panic in the crowded portions of the city. Many street lamps were extinguished by the shocks.

Owing to the fact that speculators are amassing wheat in the eastern Russian provinces, to the detriment of the thousands of famished people, the Czar has sent the Mayor of Moscow to purchase 15,000,000 roubles' worth of wheat, all of which will be distributed among the starving. He has empowered the Mayor to offer a fair price for the wheat, and if the speculators then refuse to sell, he is instructed to confiscate the amount of wheat required.

There were 186 fewer births and 1,198 more deaths in London than the average. The number of deaths in London due primarily to influenza rose from 95 to 271, beside 63 due secondarily to that cause.

The deaths in the metropolis from ordinary diseases of the respiratory organs rose to 1,248. There were only 13 hours of bright sunshine in London during the week. All over the country the semi-panic prevails on account of the growth of the dangerous malady.

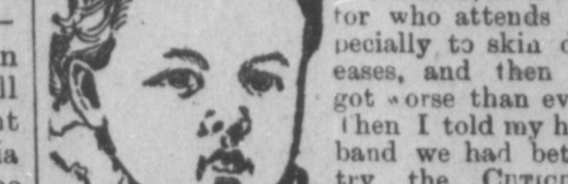
