New Brunswick

The steam and water power mill owned by Messrs. Rourke Brothers, at St. Martins was destroyed by fire.

United States

The most destructive cyclone that ever visited eastern Kansas passed through Williamstown and the surrounding country in Jefferson county,

June 29th. It took in a tract of country half a mile wide and six miles long. Not a house, barn or tree was left standing in its path. It was accompanied by terrific rain and midnight darkness. Ten bodies have been so far recovered and it is known at least five more were killed. The bodies of all were terribly mangled. The limbs of one of the victims were found in a tree a mile from the house; another's head was severed from the body. Three persons were fatally injured and many others severely hurt. Thirty others were blown down.

British and Foreign.

Cholera is rapidly decreasing throughout Russia. Only an occasional death and a few fresh cases are now reported.

The British warships Victoria and Camperdown collided near Malta on June 22nd and the Camperdown sank shortly afterward with 400 of her officers and crew. Many might have been saved but with true heroism they stuck to the vessel and gave their lives trying to save her.

Of 316 German deputies whose elections are reported 166 will enter the reichstag opposed to the Army bill and 150 favoring it. Eighty-one constituencies are still to be heard from.

While the ancient church of Romano on the Volga, was crowded with pilgrims a panic was caused by a false alarm of fire, raised by thieves in order to facilitate their operations. In the mad rush to the exit hundreds had been knocked down and trampled upon, while others had been suffocated by pressure of the great throng of terror-stricken people. The bodies of 126 women and ten men were taken from the church. Several other persons were killed and fatally injured by leaping from the windows.

Presbyterianism in Canada.

In a Montreal paper's correspondence from the Presbyterian General Assembly, in session at Brantford, is the following summary of the extent and condition of the Presbyterian church in Canada:

Throughout the Presbyterian field in Canada, which extends from Newfoundland on the east to Vancouver Island on the west, there are between two thousand six hundred and two thousand seven hundred churches and stations supplied with ordinaries. These worshipping places have accommodation for over half a million worshippers.

Last year over nineteen thousand new communicants were added to the church. Baptism was administered to nearly eleven thousand infants and to nearly one thousand adults in 1892. Over six thousand elders and ten thousand other office-bearers are associated with the ministers in managing the affairs of the denomination. More than sixteen thousand superintendents, teachers and officers look after the interests of the hundred and forty thousand pupils who are in attendance at the Sunday schools of the church. In the Sunday school and Congregational libraries are over two hundred and seventeen thousand volumes. Viewing the Presbyterian denomination financially, the following figures will be of interest:

The amounts paid to ministers last year aggregated within a few dollars of eight hundred and eighteen thousand dollars. More than four hundred and twenty thousand dollars during the same period were expended, in addition, upon church buildings and manes, besides an extra of the same amount upon incidental and congregational objects. The total expenditure for strictly congregational purposes for the year ending May, 1892, was one million six hundred and fifty-nine thousand nine hundred and thirty-eight dollars. For outside purposes the church expended last year in the maintenance of its theological colleges a little over forty thousand dollars. Forty-seven thousand dollars were given for work in the home mission field. Nearly thirty thousand were expended upon French evangelization, while to the work in India, China, the New Hebrides, Trinidad and the Indian fields in the Northwest, the aid was over ninety-three thousand dollars. For the purpose of augmenting the salaries of ministers in the weaker fields to the minimum of seven hundred and fifty dollars and a free house, the treasurer disbursed more than thirty-two thousand dollars. The ordinary payments into the aged and infirm ministers' fund for last year

were ten thousand odd dollars, to which must be added another sixteen thousand towards the endowment of the same fund. The widows and orphans' fund had an income during the same period of between six thousand and seven thousand dollars. Adding to the aforementioned sums that of nearly five thousand dollars belonging to the assembly expense fund, the total payments made to the outside schemes of this church for one year presented an aggregate of over two hundred and ninety thousand dollars. Of this total nearly twenty-eight thousand dollars were contributed by Sunday-school and Bible classes, while the Woman's Foreign Missionary societies summed up the annual gift to the general treasury of over thirty-nine thousand dollars. The synod and presbytery funds reported an income of eight thousand five hundred dollars. In addition to all these the church paid out last year for benevolent and other religious purposes over one hundred and eight thousand dollars. The grand total of payments made for all purposes at the close of the last ecclesiastical year, running from May to May, was no less than two millions and sixty-seven thousand two hundred and thirty-five dollars.
