## News of the Week.

## New Brunswick.

Albert Burgess, of St. John, and a fireman on the C. P. R. and brother of conductor Burgess, had his right arm so badly injured in an accident on the Boston & Albany railway recently, that he had to have the arm amputated.

The York county council will at its next session discuss a proposition for councillors to be elected for two years instead of one.

A few days ago, working in the lumber woods, on the Restigouche, Wm. Campbellton, was struck on the head by an unnoticed and falling limb and killed. Mr. Connell never spoke and died in the afternoon on his way to Campbellton. Deceased was unmarried and about 40 years of age.

Forty-one cadets have entered the Infantry School here, for the term commencing on Monday last. The list including 6 officers, 11 sergeants, 5 corporals, 15 privates and 4 buglers, with more to arrive.

The Chatham World says that last week a good many men were coming out of the woods in consequence of the absence of snow. The yarding is done and there is no snow for hauling.

During 1892 the sum of \$127,908 was deposited in the Savings Bank in Fredericton and \$97,978.93 was withdrawn. The deposits last week were \$8,352, the largest week's deposits, in twenty years.

Thursday, at Harcourt, Kent, Co., John Boomer's residence was destroyed by fire last evening. Nothing was saved. There is no insurance. Boomer was away in the lumber woods.

Diphtheria is on the increase in St. John, and many houses are placarded for the disease. Scarlet fever placards are also up in some localities.

The Edison company has entered into a \$25,000 contract to light Yarmouth with electricity.

The lease of areas of the Dominion Gold Mining company, adjoining the Wellington mine in Sherbrooke district, have been declared forfeited on the ground of non-compliance with the statute regarding the amount of work performed.

A sad shooting occurred at Lunenburg, N. S., last week, by which Edward Owen, a prominent resident, will lose his life. The servant girl had gone in his room to clean up when she found him on the floor with a revolver in his hand. He had a bullet hole over his right eye and a revolver in his hand. Owen is about 45 years old and was formerly principal of the academy of Lunenburg.

None to soon, Yarmouth is to have a new hotel. The sum of \$30,000 has been subscribed by the citizens. It is expected to be completed during the coming summer.

Carter, for stealing from a house on the Morse road Annapolis was Tuesday sentenced by Judge Savory to two years imprisonment in the penitentiary.

An insurance agent wrote out papers recently for a party who was one of fourteen children, all living. His father and mother were both living, between eighty and ninety years of age, and his four grand parents at his death averaged one hundred years each. It is needless to say he passed. He was a Nova Scotian.

Application will be made to the Local Legislature of Nova Scotia for incorporation of a company to be called the Annapolis and Granville Bridge and Harbor Improvement Company (Ltd). One of the objects is to build a bridge between Annapolis and Granville Ferry.

In Halifax, William Jenny, aged about 65, committed suicide Thursday by shooting himself with a gun. He had been subject to fits of temporary insanity for some time.

## United States.

New York has numerous cases of typhus fever.

On Tuesday Mrs. Wm. E. Jenkins, Roxbury, killed her child and attempted to take her own life by shooting, stabbing and inhaling gas. She was insane.

Geo. Mayhey, a Nova Scotian, manager for Batchelder and Lincoln, shoe manufacturers, Boston, committed suicide by hanging. He was 40 years old, married.

Mr. C. A. Nason, of Ashland, Maine, speaking of the lumber cut on the Aroostook this winter, says that it will exceed that of last year by three or four million feet. Messrs. Warner, so far, the season has been very good for the work. There is about six inches of snow, which makes the work easy.

## British and Foreign.

A plot to burn up the city of Buenos Ayres was discovered a few days ago, and a number of policemen and firemen were arrested on the charge of being connected with the conspiracy. The plan of the conspirators was to set fire to the city in several different places at once. Their object was plunder.

Fifteen men were killed by a coal mine explosion at Retchitz, Russia, on Tuesday.

Hundreds of villages in Austria are completely isolated on account of the snow blockades. A cable on Tuesday said: Violent snow storms are reported from Austria and Hungary. All kinds of traffic is suspended and scores of villages completely isolated. Express trains have been snow-bound and the services of the military called upon to extricate them. In Vienna the snow is piled ten or twelve feet high between the roads and sidewalks. No marketmen are able to come to town. A milk and butter famine is proclaimed by produce dealers.

On Wednesday, a passenger train from Vienna, collided with a passenger train from Stuhlweisburg. Eight passengers were killed instantly, and five sustained injuries probably fatal. Ten were wounded severely, but not mortally. Hardly a person escaped uninjured.

St. Petersburg reports severe frosts in Eastern Russia and western Siberia. At Olmsk the thermometer has fallen 50° below zero, the lowest point yet recorded.

It is reported that Charles de Lesseps has made a full and unreserved statement to the government of all the facts within his knowledge in relation to the beneficiaries of the Panama corruption. In consideration of this information he is to be treated with great leniency, if not admitted to absolute immunity. It is stated M. de Lesseps' motives are not only to secure immunity from law, but also to convince the public that the Panama Company was forced by irresistible pressure on the part of officials and the press to choose between wholesale corruption and threatened ruin of the enterprises. De Lesseps' admissions are said to be of the most startling character and will create a sensation in America as well as in France.
