News of the Week.

New Brunswick.

Dalhousie Academy, a large wooden building occupied as school house, was burned to the ground Wednesday.

Mr. William Coburn, of Keswick, had his leg amputated Saturday close to the thigh. A cancer was the cause.

Hartley Dow of Canterbury was brought to town Thursday, under arrest for stabbing a man with a knife at Canterbury Station election night.

The body of Charles Taber was found at Savage Island a few days. He lived in Woodstock, and disappeared last October. The supposition at the time was that he was drowned, which now proves to have been correct. He was brother of Mr. J. W. Taber of this city.

Chief Justice Took opened the adjourned sitting of York nisi prius court Thursday when it was expected the trial of the church case, Gutter vs. Randolph, would be proceeded with. The judge announced that at the request of the Attorney General and Dr. Pugsley, the counsel interested, he had consented to further adjourn the court until 8th September.

Jack Ross, a boy, was killed in the Canada Eastern Railway yard at Chatham, Thursday. His father is yardmaster, and he was helping him place cars. The trainmen were putting a box on a siding. The boy had just set up the brake and in coming off the car before it stopped, fell across the rail, the tender passing over him. His father saw him fall, and picked him up a mangled corpse.

A terrible work place at Doherty's mill, Campbellton, resulting in the death of James Ritchie. Ritchie and a Frenchman named Provost quarrelled. Ritchie had Provost down and was choking him, when a brother of Provost struck Ritchie a terrible blow on the head with a peevie, which knocked him senseless. Both of the Provosts are in jail. Ritchie belongs to Rogersville and leaves a wife and family.

Serious Football Accident.

While two of our local clubs were playing a game of football the other day, one of the Morning Star quarter-backs met with quite a serious accident. The ball had been passed out of the scrimmage dangerously near the goal line, and the player was trying to get into the coveted position, when Harry B. made a great run, tackled his opponent, and they went down together. The game was saved, and the tide turned in favor of the Morning Stars, but Harry B. found it impossible to rise. He had badly sprained his left ankle and fainted away. Ettinger who was whittling threw back his hand at his assailant and struck him in the abdomen. Clark's case is precarious.

Other Provinces.

Fire at Fenelon Falls, Ont., Saturday night, destroyed twelve million feet of lumber belonging to J. W. Howery & Sons.

Trouble has broken out on that part of Newfoundland coast where the French have fishery rights between the residents and the French fishermen over the use of cod traps. The English cruiser Mohawk has been summoned hastily to the scene.

Crops are very promising in the Upper Provinces. Happily there is no drought area this year as there was last.

John G. Moore, of Hawthorne, Ont., was killed by lightning in Sunday's storm.

At Chatham, Ont., during the excitement on election day a balcony of the Exchange hotel collapsed while a crowd stood underneath. Several persons were severely and probably fatally injured.

Mooney's flour mills at Alexandria, Ont., were destroyed by fire Thursday night; loss \$30,000.

The Superior court of Quebec gave a most important decision Thursday, in the case of Rev. Cure Gill, who refused to answer a question put to him in court, because he claimed the information desired had been given him under the seal of the confessional. The court upheld him Thursday morning, and maintained that matters confided to a priest in the confessional were privileged.

At Windsor, Ont., Michael O'Rourke, Conservative, who lost everything he owned on the result of the recent election, attempted to commit suicide Friday. He stabbed himself repeatedly in the abdomen with a five inch knife. His recovery is doubtful.

United States.

One of the severest hail and rain storms in a generation passed over Centre county, Pennsylvania, a few days ago. The damage to grain fields is very great. Grain in entire fields was beaten as prostrate as if a roller had passed over it. Many fruit trees were completely stripped.

A freight train on the Main Central railroad, ran into a boulder lying on the track, east of Freeport, Me. Thursday, and was wrecked. Engineer Griffin and Fireman Pettengill were badly hurt. The engine is a total wreck.

While 90 miners were at work in the Twin shaft at Pittsburgh, Pa. Saturday morning the roof caved in and it is believed that all of the men perished. About 40 of the imprisoned miners were English speaking miners, the other foreigners. Thirty Poles and Hungarians were entombed and it is thought that the total number of bodies in the mine will reach 100.
