News of the Week.

New Brunswick.

A chert factory has just been started at Baie Verte, N. B.

John Akerley of Southampton York Co., fell between the body and the wheels of his double wagon Wednesday and was severely hurt.

St. Louis village, Kent Co., was visited by a fire Monday evening. Joseph Allaire, merchant, lost his store and house. Aime Leblanc, his blacksmith shop and house; Cyriaque D'Aigle, his house. The loss is partly covered by insurance.

Mr. and Mrs. Wandlass, this city, are receiving congratulations on the birth of their nineteenth child, which happy event occurred Friday evening. The couple have been married 21 years and ten of their children are living.

The farmers in Farmerston, Bloomfield and Waterville, C. Co., have been losing sheep by dogs. The parties who have suffered are many. Below Woodstock the farmers have suffered also this summer.

Outcroppings of coal of a good burning quality are found in the mountain district in Moncton parish, and the provincial borer, which has been in operation at the 'gorge' for the past two or three months, has gone to a depth of 700 feet, passing through what mining experts say is the true coal formation. They have not, however, found any body of coal, but while digging for a well on the Vaubuskin farm, in the same area, the men came upon a four foot seam.

It is stated that there is a jam of seven or eight thousand logs grounded at Grand Falls and in the rapids below, which will require much labor to break.

Thursday afternoon, at Harcourt, Kent Co., William Wilt, working in Cail's mill, had his right hand cut off with the edger.

Major D. McLeod Vince has been asked by the Fredericton City Council to represent the City in arbitration about the John H. Reid claim.

Robt. Bowes, aged 63, of Golden Grove, was killed in St. John Saturday. He was on a load of hay being driven through a covered alley. There could have been little more than 18 inches from the top of the load to the boards above. The horse halted going in and Bowes urged the animal on. The horse started, it is supposed, suddenly. O'Leary, who was driving, did not turn till the yard was reached and then saw his companion lying back on the hay. He spoke to him but found life was extinct. His head had struck the beam and his neck had probably been broken.

The vast business of which Mr. Gibson has been the head, is being transferred to a joint stock company, in which Mr. Gibson has the controlling interest. This is Mr. Gibson's way of providing for the perpetuation of the business in the event of anything happening to himself. In addition to his large numbering and milling operations Mr. Gibson conducts the Marysville Cotton Mills and is the chief, possibly the sole, owner of the Canada Eastern Railway from Fredericton to Chatham Junction on the Intercolonial.

About 500,000 salmon in the Sydney fish hatchery are now ready to be liberated in the rivers in Cape Breton. Fifty thousand were placed in Trout Brook, Mira, and two hundred and fifty thousand in the rivers at St. Ann's Ingonish and Aspy Bay last week.

Twenty-five years ago the spring was cold, wet and backward, similar to the present season. A farmer in Gay's River commenced planting and sowing on the 22nd June, 1872, and finished putting in crop on the 11th July, yet that year he reaped a most bountiful harvest.

Other Provinces.

Montreal city hall was seized Friday and bailiffs are now in possession of all the property belonging to the city. The seizure was made for \$10,000 alleged to be due as law costs in an expropriation case. This action was taken at the instance of eighty-eight parties. The Mayor and corporation characterize the procedure as an outrage, and intend to fight the case to the end.

Fred Glasgow, of John, N. B., was killed near St. John's Nfld., by the engine on the train for Harbor Grace exploding. His body was torn to pieces. The passenger cars were left standing on the track. The fireman was not fatally hurt, but with Glasgow, who was the engineer, was thrown a hundred feet from the scene of the explosion. Mr. Glasgow was the eldest son of Mr. H. Adam Glasgow, of Carleton, superintendent of ferries.

United States.

Fire in a business block in the south-eastern part of San Francisco on Sunday cost three firemen their lives and entailed a property loss of \$100,000.

Three trainmen lost their lives in a Boston and Maine railway disaster near Exeter, N. H., early Thursday morning.

Theodore Durrant, the murderer of Blanche Lamont, will be reprieved, Governor Budd has decided upon this course in order to settle the question of the rights of the federal courts to interfere in the execution of a sentence imposed by the state court.

On Tuesday, Rev. Berry Lawson, Methodist, Barboursville, Ky., was shot and instantly killed by his 15-year-old son. The father whipped the boy for some slight offense. The punishment angered the boy, and finding his father in a cornfield he slipped up behind him and blew his head from his shoulders with a shot gun.

The Wilcox & White organ company, of Meriden, Conn., one of the largest manufacturers of organs in the United States have made an assignment.

A match carelessly dropped by a workman in a fireworks factory at Chicago on Monday night caused a terrific explosion, and a number of employees were badly hurt by flying rockets and candles. All the windows in the block were demolished, and the building, a four-story structure was badly damaged. The loss is estimated at \$60,000.

Last week a destructive hail storm completely destroyed crops of all kinds north of Rogers, Texas, and great damage was done to houses. Several persons were injured. At Waeider, lightning struck the residence of N. F. Miller, killing his son. At Holland, the Methodist and Christian churches were wrecked and several houses were unroofed and their contents nearly ruined.

British and Foreign.

It is positively stated that Capt. Gen. Weyler will soon return to Spain from Cuba.

The zarina was delivered of a daughter at St. Petersburg Thursday.

A repetition of the Paris horror is reported from Tien Tsin, China. Over 100 persons lost their lives in an attempt to escape from a burning death-trap.

Earthquakes were experienced Sunday in the State of Oaxaca, Mexico, and some damage was done on the Isthmus of Tehuantepec, where lightly constructed houses were cracked. One shock lasted forty seconds.

Tuesday a boiler exploded in the print works in Pueblo, Mexico, causing the death of twenty or more persons. A fireman three blocks from the explosion had his head completely torn off.

On Sunday an attempt was made to assassinate M. Faure, the president of the French republic. While M. Faure's carriage was passing a thick bomb, charged with powder and swan shot, exploded. No one was injured by the explosion. A man was arrested.

In Berlin, Sunday, Herr Woelfert, an aeronaut, accompanied by a merchant named Kanbe, made an aerial ascent in a so-called air-ship. When the balloon had reached a height of 3,000 feet, a loud explosion was heard, and the next moment the balloon was seen to be ablaze. The car detached itself from the burning silk and fell to the ground. Both of its occupants were found to be dead. Their bodies were horribly burned.

It is said the British naval manoeuvres this year will take the form of a grand procession around the United Kingdom with a view of showing the strength of the navy at the various ports.

An earthquake was felt at Calcutta Friday afternoon. Several buildings were cracked. The shock extended across the Hoogli river, where serious damage was done. Several buildings collapsed. Some lives were lost and a number of people injured more or less severely.

Five hundred fishermen were lost, it is estimated, in a gale which on May 6 visited the Canusan Archipelago, off the coast of China. Marge particulars of the disaster were brought by the steamer "Empress of Japan." It was one of those sudden hurricanes for which the coast of China is noted and the fishermen had no chance to seek shelter. Their light boats were smashed and of the hundreds out at the time very few returned. The storm swept the entire archipelago, which extends across the mouth of Manchow Bay. Several large junks were lost, in which scores perished.

THIRD RAIL SYSTEM.—The plan of applying electric power to locomotion by utilizing a third rail to convey the current, was successfully tested in Connecticut this week. A run of ten miles, from New Britain to Hartford, on the New England road, was made in 13 1-2 minutes. There was less jar experienced than in an ordinary railway car. Part of the distance was covered at a faster rate than a mile a minute. The engine room where the power is generated provides for five engines with an aggregate of 10,000 horse power. The cars are about 50 feet long. Each car has a chime whistle and a big gun at each end. Instead of an overhead trolley, the electric current passes to the propelling machinery of the car by two shoes, 33 feet apart, which are in contact with the third rail. The test made on Monday is announced to have been in every way a success.—The Sun.
