DOMINION ALLIANCE.—The Council of the Dominion Alliance is called to meet in Toronto on Wednesday, July 10th. It is expected that every Province of the Dominion will be represented. The present position of the Prohibition movement will be considered.

According to a report of a member of the United States Geological Survey, who has been making a tour of observation in Cuba, the mineral resources of that island are of much greater extent and variety than has ever been thought. He says that in Matanzas Province he found copper, iron and asphaltum, and on the Isle of Pines, deposits of marble such as are equalled in but few places in the world.
