NEW BRUNSWICK

Dr. W. W. White was elected Mayor of St. John last Tuesday. His majority over Mr. Colwell was 1800.

Mr. W. K. Allen, of Fredericton, died on Wednesday last. He was a son of the late Chief Justice Allen, and formerly represented York County in the Legislature. He had many friends.

Mr. Wm. Kinghorn, son of the late Rev. Wm. Kinghorn, and well known in connection with the Foresters, died Friday in this city. He had a host of friends and was highly respected.

The stranded Str. Lake Superior was sold at auction in St. John Saturday, and was bought by a Boston firm for \$26,000.

The steamer Victoria of the Starline will go on the Fredericton route about the first of next month.

A very sad accident occurred at Doyle's Mill, Rose Bank, Thursday. While Thos. McKenzie was removing a staging from a chimney a brick fell, struck him on the head and killed him instantly. He was 28 years old and leaves a wife and two young children.

As the second son of Rev. B. H. Nobles was playing around a window on Sunday, 13th, the sash fell on his left hand, completely severing one of the fingers and almost taking off another. Doctors Burns and McAllister gave the necessary surgical aid. They replaced the severed members and have hopes that they will grow together again.

In Fredericton, Wednesday, a female infant's body was found in the water closet of the Lorne hotel. The body was discovered by a party of workmen.

NOVA SCOTIA

It is said that nearly \$1,000,000 worth of ham, bacon and lard is imported into Nova Scotia yearly. Only 3,000 hogs or \$30,000 worth is raised in our own Province.

The local Government has appointed to be a Justice of the Peace, George Gray of Stellarton and to be Sheriff of Cape Breton George B. Ingraham, of Sydney, in place of William Buchanan, resigned.

Benjamin Smith, of Lower Burlington met a terrible death recently. While placing fuel on a bonfire in his garden he took a fit and fell face downward into the flames, receiving injuries that caused his death.

It is stated that the Nova Scotia Steel & Coal Company, New Glasgow has decided to begin the manufacture of steel cars.

The Dominion Iron and Steel Co. and the Coal Co. of Sydney have amalgamated. W.H. Whitney has retired from the Presidency.

On Wednesday, an explosion occurred at the sawmill of James Gass & Son near Shubenacadie. Albert Boutilier was blown 101 feet but was not killed. His injuries included a broken arm and a number of bruises. The boiler was found thirty feet from the wrecked building. The mill was totally destroyed.

Albert Tupper, aged 18 years, a native of Advocate Harbor, met a sudden death in a strange manner Saturday evening, at St. John. Tupper was cook on the schooner Serene, lying at North Market wharf. While the crew were eating supper, Tupper went on deck to listen to the German band which was playing on Water street. About 10 minutes after he left the cabin, the mate went on deck and was horrified to find the young fellow hanging by the neck from the main boom dead. The fatal cord was of two mainsail reef points, which had been crossed under his chin and tucked in near the ears a couple of times. The Captain thinks the young man had been standing near the boom, and while playing with the reef points, put them around his neck and may have slipped, so that the ropes strangled him and he could not give an alarm.

Two men were killed and one is dying as a result of an accident on the Halifax street railway Sunday evening. J.A. Scott and Peter Gilfoxy and Chas. Shorten were out driving. At the corner of North street and Windsor road their wagon came in collision with a car of the street railway. The men were thrown to the street and the car wheels passing over them, severed the bodies of Gilfoxy Shorten and cut off Scott's left arm. The conductor and motorman of the car are under arrest.

The steamer City of Pittsburg, from Cincinnati to Memphis, was burned to the waters' edge early Sunday morning at Turner's Landing, near Olmstead, Ill. Reports state that 65 lives were lost and that many were badly burned and otherwise injured, but the list of casualties is not yet definitely determined. Most of the passengers were in bed when the alarm was given.

An Eastport despatch says: the large ambergris find in bay back of Campo bello recently has been vouched for and the find proven a fortune for the finders, Messrs. Mitchell and Story, of Lubec. A chemist was sent there last week, who gave it all the known tests and proved it to be the genuine, simple pure article, worth something like \$40,000.

A Nova Scotia girl was married to a wealthy Chinaman in San Francisco on April 12th. Alderman Florence married Charlie Chong, a wealthy Chinese merchant, of Boston, and Miss Mary McDonald of Nova Scotia a missionary among the Chinese.

The Bangor and Aroostock Railway hauled 667,306 bushels of potatoes out of Aroostock county up to the end of March amounted to 3,089,409 bushels. One of Aroostock's largest potato dealers estimated that the per cent. of the 1901 crop yet remains to be marketed. The potato plant this spring will be considerably in advance of any preceding year, if one may judge from the quantity of fertilizers purchased.

BRITISH AND FOREIGN

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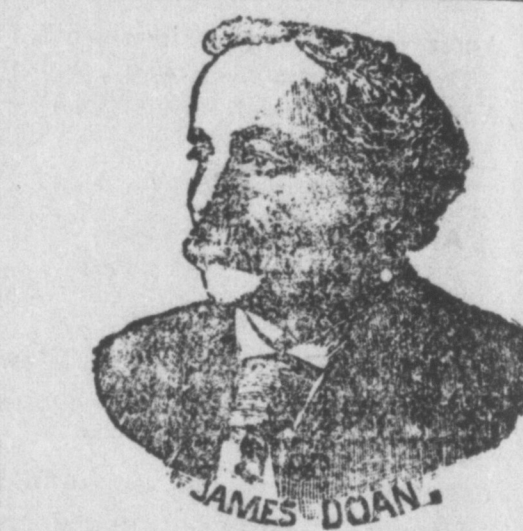
