- "Peace that passeth understanding" fills the soul for whom he died.



He thought that an equivalent might be offered for the baptism with the Holy Spirit. He wanted power but not by the divine method. The divine method is to remove sin from the heart, for sin is the great source of human weakness. He wanted to live in the realm of wonders and do great things, and make a name for himself and have great multitudes follow him and worship him.

There is a great deal of this endeavor today -to have Holy Ghost results without seeking the Holy Ghost by the Scriptural method. Cnurches and ministers want additions to the membership and many conversions, and spir-

to get the consent and influence of the Spirit in every way except by asking Him to come and expel sin from the heart and dwell there all the time. In the place of His sanctifying work, other things are substituted. The modern church entertainment, the ecclesiastical quest for church amusement; the subordination of spiritual interests to the will of those who are rich; the mania for pulpit eloquence, often regardless of spirituality; the employment of worldings to praise God for the whole congregation; anything or anybody that will draw a crowd, are attempts to bribe the Holy Spirit, to depart from His method of working and to give spiritual results without spiritual life.

The Holy Ghost was not in it. He could not be bribed. Peter said to Simon, "Thy money perish with thee, because thou hast thought that the gift of God may be purchased with money." It is not to be purchased that way. It is still very difficult to make many see that the Lord is not specially interested in churches or people, who put money, fashion, eloquence, culture, education, ritualism, sociality, etc., etc., above and ahead of holiness. It is still difficult for unspiritual people to comprehend that it is not the size, nor social standing, nor wealth of the church that commends itself to God. He prefers lowly, obedient, consecrated people and churches, who will allow Him to have His way. He hated idolatry and will not suffer anything or anybody to be worshipped in place of Himself, whether it be pope, bishop, priest, money, fashion, eloquence, or anything else. And nothing can buy Him. He comes as a gift only to those who feel so poor that they cannot get along without Him.-Christian Witness.

WALKING WITH GOD.
