A God Called Ministry.

As Moses, Aaron and Samuel, to whom God spoke audibly, "Unto thee O man do I call." Not a college call, not a Father call. not a man call. It needs a practical man, to preach a practical gospel to reach man's needs.

"To preach the Gospel a man must be a partaker of the Gospel.

"Men at the head of the way are frequently in the way, hence our country is full of indifference to the Gospel of Jesus Christ. God never called an unsaved man to preach the Gospel, although He may have called men to repentance with that purpose in view.

"There is no calling so high, so honorable, as the calling of God to the Gospel ministry. Every man who enters the ministry should be satisfied within himself that he has been called of God, otherwise he will be in doubt of his call which will be a constant source of weakness.

We cannot depend on impressions. We cannot trust our emotions, but we must set our faith on the Word of God and the guidance of the Holy Spirit through the word. The man who receives the call will say, like Samuel, "Speak Lord, thy servant heareth." God. calls The following ministers attended the Alli- men away from all things which are unlike himself. Men are called at different periods of life, young, middle aged, or even older. He is called to represent Christ,—to be a representative of Jesus Christ is no mean calling. W. should avail himself of every opportunity to fit himself for his calling. It is not enough for a man to know a thing, but he must know that he knows it.

A preacher of the Gospel must be a man of good moral character. Men may destroy his reputation but cannot destroy his character. The character must back up his profession. He must be an honest and truthful man, if he makes a promise, he must meet his promise. He mut be a man of strong faith and a man of courage. To be strong he must be a meek man. He must enter the doors of opportunity which God opens to him.
