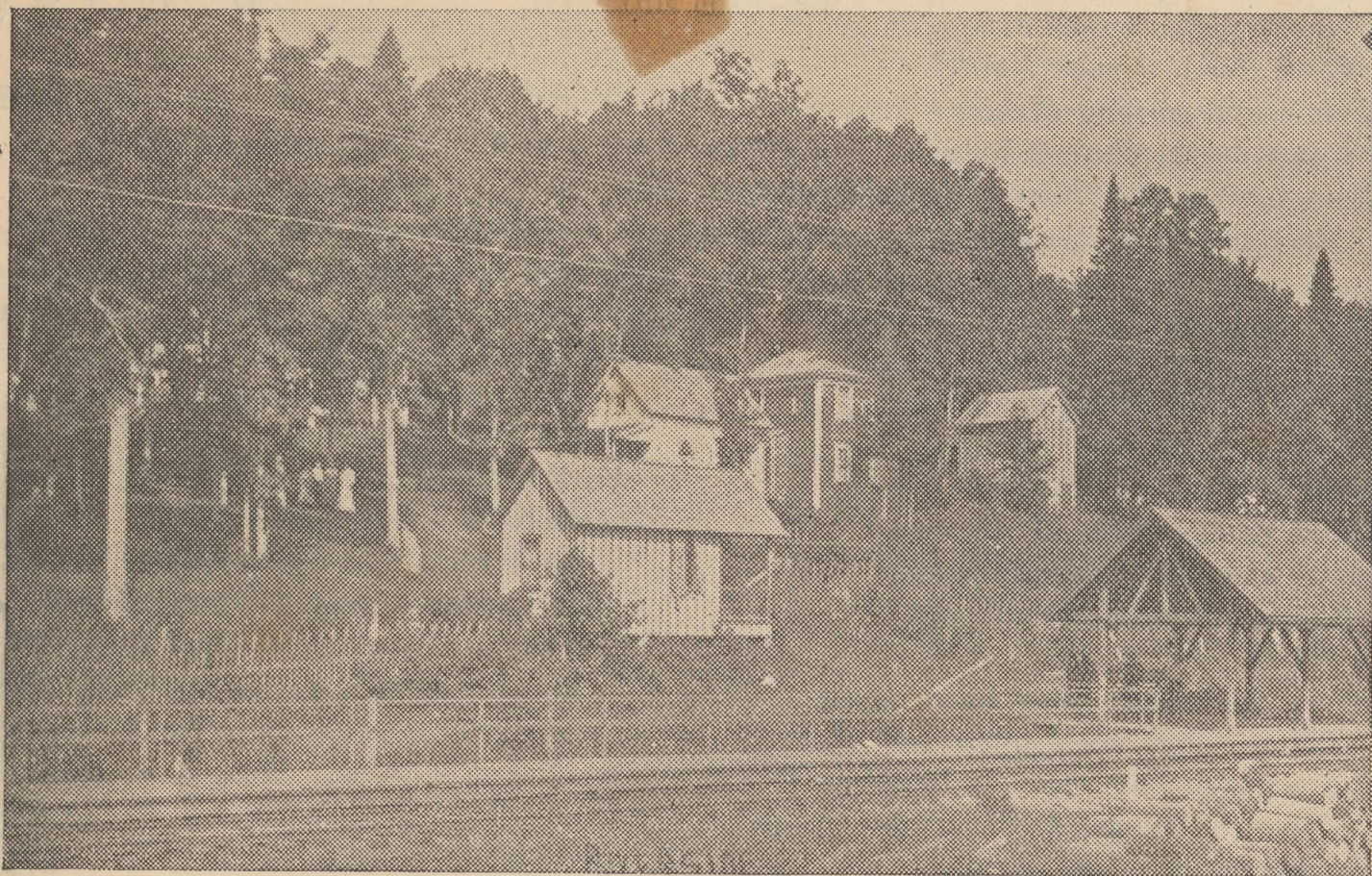
NOTICE

MEMORIAL SERVICE

To Late W. L. Estabrooks Held at Reformed Baptist Church, Marysville

Marysville, June 12.—The memorial service to the memory of the late Mr. W. L. Estabrooks, held in the Reformed Baptist church last evening was largely attended. The service was conducted by the pastor, Rev. H. Smith assisted by Rev. S. A. Baker, of Fredericton, and Rev. J. W. Williams, of this place. The service began by singing Rock of Ages, after which Rev. Mr. Williams read appropriate selections of Scripture. Rev. Mr. Baker followed with prayer. The choir rendered the hymn That Beautiful City of Gold. Rev. Mr. Williams sang a solo entitled Looking This Way. The pastor referred to the life of the late Mr. Estabrooks as a church worker, as a citizen and as a friend, setting forth the sterling qualities of the deceased gentleman. Rev. Mr. Baker, who had known the late Mr. Estabrooks since boyhood, reviewed the life and work of that gentleman, and read a brief biography written by him previous to his departure for New York and published in the Highway, the church's official organ. Rev. Mr. Baker extolled the virtues of their departed friend and was followed by Rev. Mr. Williams, who also feelingly referred to the exemplary Christian life of the departed. The services closed with the benediction by Rev. Mr. Baker. As a citizen the late Mr. Estabrooks was honored and esteemed by all who knew him, and the large attendance at the service was proof of this fact.—Gleaner.
