##### TRUE RICHES.

*Rejoice in the Lord always; and again I say rejoice.*

*Let your moderation be known unto all men. The Lord is at hand.*

*Be careful for nothing, but in everything, by prayer and supplication with thanksgiving, let your requests be made known unto God.*

*And the peace of God, which passeth understanding, shall keep your hearts and minds through Christ Jesus.—Phils. 4, 5-6-7.*

This reveals the fact of a deep, conscious, abiding and powerful indwelling of the Holy Spirit, to produce an ever-flowing joy in a man's life and experience. This is true riches.

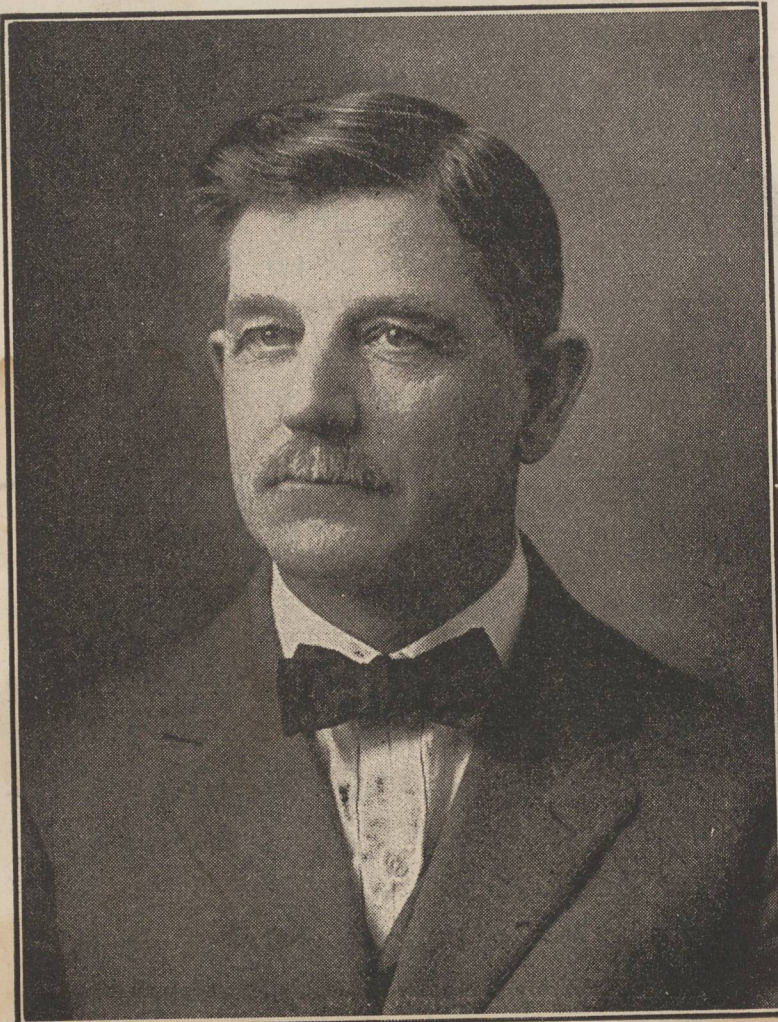
This is beyond all outward forms of religion, and a million times better than an annual camp meeting blessing, because it continues the year round in all places, conditions and circumstances. It suggests the cessation of every disturbance within the heart and mind that we would wish to hide from men. "Let your moderation be known to all men. This has been very injuriously applied by people to religion, and people became so moderate that they could not be distinguished from other sinners.

James puts it beautifully, thus: *Who is a wise man and endued with knowledge among you? Let him shew out of a good conversation his works with meekness of wisdom. But if ye have bitter envying and strife in your hearts, glory not, and lie not against the truth. This wisdom descendeth not from above, but is earthly, sensual, devilish. For where envying and strife is there is confusion, and every evil work. But the wisdom that is from above is first pure, then peaceable, gentle and easy to be entreated, full of mercy and good fruits, without (wrangling) partiality and without hypocrisy. And the fruit of righteousness is sown in peace of them that make peace. Unto all men. If we have this type of moderation, it is with us at all times, in our homes, in business, among our brethren in the church, and away from home, in secret, in public. "The Lord is at hand" always, so whatever we do is done in his presence.*

Freedom from corroding care. *Be careful for nothing.* What a tremendous transformation if the people of God would hear this command of the great apostle. How the self-imposed burdens would roll off from a million hearts and minds. We hear this moan of distrust of God everywhere. What if I should die without property or life insurance, what would become of my family? What if I should be laid by? What if my crop should fail? What if! What if! What if! If we are the rich children of God, with access to his throne and are in the beautiful sunshine of our text.

What the result?

The peace of God (not peace with God of justification alone), but "the peace of God,

BOARD.—\$3.50 per week, 75 cents per day. Dinner, 35 cents; on Sunday 50 cents.

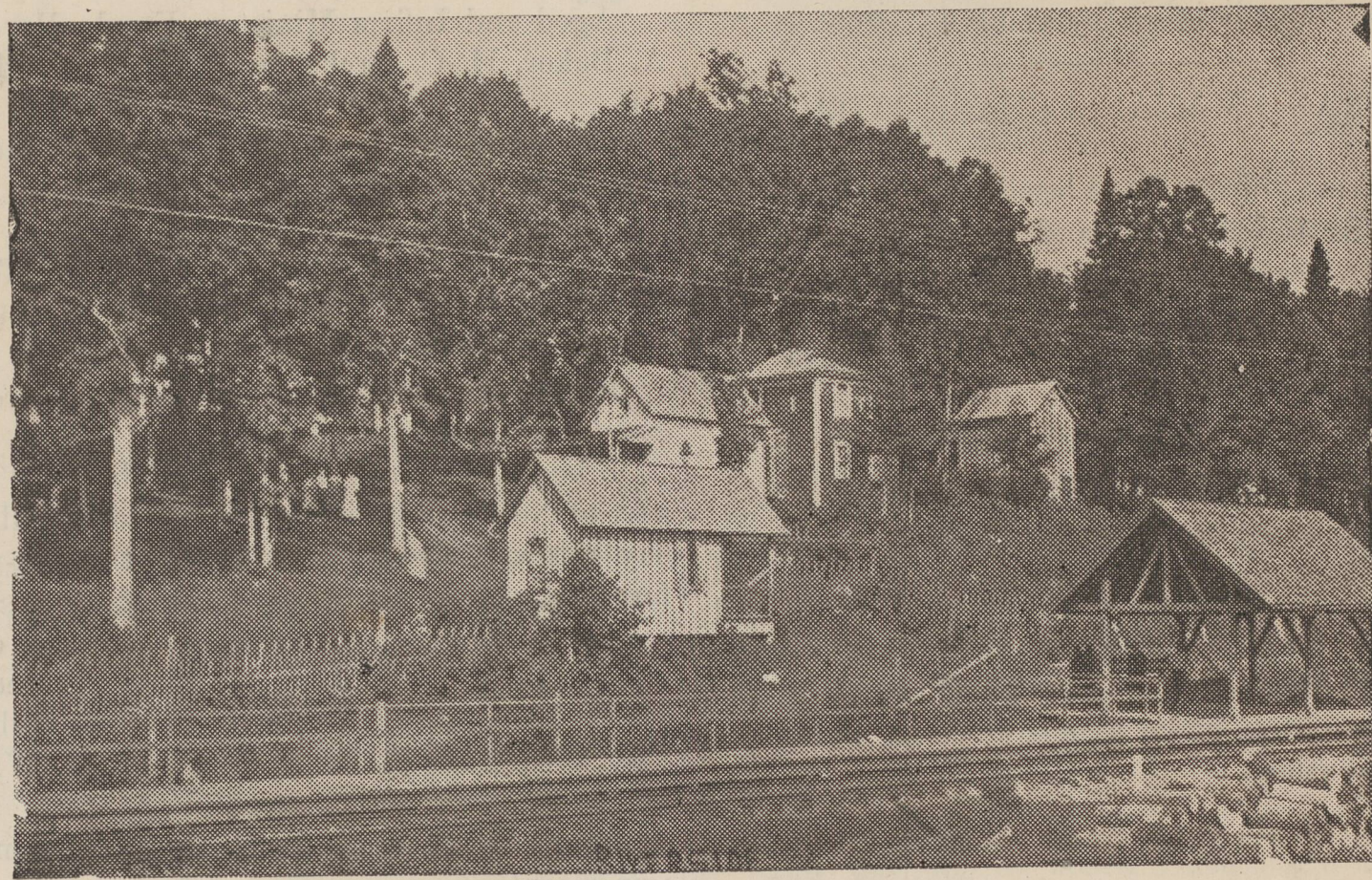
FURNISHED ROOMS, 50 and 75 cents per day. STABLING for 90 horses. Hay for horses; no grain.
