COMMUNION.

Not forsaking the assembling of ourselves together, as the manner of some is, but exhorting one another and so much the more as ye see the day approaching. Heb. 10, 25.

I baptized 68 and received 32 young people into the church, some of whom are now laboring in the mission fields. At Waterville, Carleton county, Leighton Tracey gave his heart to God in special services. He is now Superintendent of Pentecostal Nazarine Missions in India (Calcutta).

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
