Balmoral --- Our South African Missionary Farm

The Alliance Executive and Missionary Board are to consider ways and means for the purchase of the farm where our mission station is established. It contains 1068 acres, and has considerable tilable land on it. The purchase price is about three dollars per acre. The writer, some years ago, undertook to raise the money to purchase at \$2.50 per acre, being the price then asked, and succeeded in raising one thousand; but as the hut rent received from the natives who lived on the farm was quite sufficient to pay the annual rent of the farm, it was decided to defer the purchase for a time. But now a new law has been enacted by which the native can pay his hut rent in labour on the farm, or for the owner of the farm on which they live. This cuts off the money income which was used for rent, and our missionaries not requiring the amount of labour that would

be due from the natives, practically gives them their hut rent free, and necessitates the immediate purchase of the farm. To do this we need an additional two thousand dollars, and we will open the subscription list in the Highway. If those who pledged money for this purpose would now pay their pledges it will give us a good start on this amount.

The time to show our greatest faith in God is when it costs us the greatest effort to carry forward his work. And we pray as we write these words that every truly consecrated brother and sister will step to the front and respond generously to this call, and that the above amount will be quickly paid in. God knows just what each one can do, so let everyone give as in His sight, and let this station become permanent missionary property, and it will ever afterwards help to sustain the missionary work of which it is the centre.
