It is a true saying,—That soul in which God dwells not, has no happiness; and he who has God has a satisfying portion.



OUR THREE-FOLD PARTNERSHIP.

In this, one of the closing articles in this series, I propose to call attention to the supremely important subject of our threefold partnership with the Holy Spirit in the carrying out of God's redemptive purposes. Let us, before we read, close our eyes for a moment, and seek His illumination that we may understand; His purification that we may be clean; and His inspiration that we may be efficient.

1. We enter into partnership when we yield ourselves to the Holy Spirit.

I met with a fine illustration the other day by that great scholar and teacher, Dr. Mabie, to whose books on the Cross I owe so much. He describes a striking experiment which a professor of Harvard University introduced into his classes every year. On the top of a board, resting on the poles of a powerful electro magnet, the professor was wont to place a loose pile of wrought iron nails. Then he would turn on

a magnetic current, passing through the coil of the instrument. The result was that a magnetic "field of force" was established throughout all the space in the neighborhood of the poles; and with this the board in no way interfered, although it kept the nails from direct contact with the magnet itself. As soon as the current passed and the field was established, the loose nails, by the mutual attraction thus determined, became, as it were, a tough plastic mass, which could be moulded into the form of an arch or any similar structure. So long as the current flowed the structure stood, but the moment the current was broken, the magnetic virtue of the field disappeared, and the structure that had been reared, crumbled into a chaotic pile.

When the exalted Christ, at the right hand of the Father, received from Him and gave the Holy Spirit at Pentecost, to render His work on earth effective, He gave the Spirit to serve also as an element in which the disciple was to have his being. He established in and through that element a field of spiritual force.

Within this field, the disciple can perform what he never otherwise could do. That field of spiritual force has existed without breach or hindrance on God's part, from Pentecost until this hour, although myriads in the Church have not thus conceived it. Many have not been taught it; others have been taught it but do not believe. What a spiritual revolution would take place if we habitually abandoned ourselves to this element of spiritual force and reckoned on the illuminating and inspiring power of the Holy Spirit!

The instant the Church entertains the thought of a break in the current and the dissolution of this field of spiritual energy, there is a complete lapse of spiritual power. The safety of the individual and the power of the church can be conserved only as the sense of living in an all-enveloping, divine atmosphere is kept alive, and is, moment by moment appropriated and used.

It is only in an habitual recognition of this fact that we can have partnership with the
