Dear Highway,—As others have been writing of the work in different sections, I have thought I had better report from this circuit. Brother and Sister H. S. Mullen as evangelists came to assist me in the work Sept. 26th. We began at Gordonsville and continued there over four Sundays. Some good was accomplished, but not what I had hoped for. It was a very busy time for one thing, and then there was a cross-haul somewhere that would not be moved. Brother and Sister Mullen are good and earnest workers. We began at Victoria on the 21st of October and from the very first prayer meeting, on the date mentioned, in the afternoon, the fire of God and power was on the saints and conviction on souls. The evangelists were with us over two Sundays, and preached and sang in the Holy Ghost; sinners were converted, backsliders reclaimed, and believers sanctified, praise the Lord. The following officers were then elected: President, Rev. P. J. Trafton; secretary, Rev. H. C. Archer; treasurer, George Gray; Highway agent, Rev. S. A. Baker.

The minutes of last meeting were read and approved. It was then resolved that Rev. Mr. Henderson and Evangelist Foster be invited to a seat in the Quarterly Meeting. The president then appointed the devotional committee.
