Editorial.

BEULAH CAMP MEETING.

The Camp Meeting as a religious gathering is an old institution. If we were so disposed we might date it back to the Jewish tabernacle as a place for a general gathering for a series of religious services; and also to the great meetings held by John the Baptist in the wilderness near Jordan, and also the great gatherings when our Lord Jesus Christ preached the gospel in many places to great multitudes. In the United States the Camp Meeting dates back many years, where great multitudes have gathered to spend ten days in tents and booths away from home and business cares by the river, or lake side, or in the maple, pine or oak groves, in the freedom and beauty of nature, there to give freedom to the voice in songs of praise and in testimony, and prayer, and to listen to the gospel story of salvation from earnest messengers of Christ, thus being refreshed and built up themselves, and bringing their young people and children under definite gospel influences, and away from the distracting of work, the school and the place of pleasure, and thus tens of thousands have given their hearts to Christ and become the foremost workers in the gospel ministry, and in missions, and in the church.

Who can imagine anything more enjoyable or beneficial to the father and mother and family than two weeks spent in a beautiful place like Beulah Camp Ground, fitted for beauty, convenience and comfort, amid the great natural beauties of the St. John river, and mountain side, with brooks and lakes, woods, hills, valleys and fields nearby, clothed in all the beauty of summer. Then add the Christian association and fellowship in the worship of God, with the conventionalities of the usual church life thrown aside, and all meet as one in a grand effort for the conversion of the unconverted, the entire sanctification of those who have been converted, and the upbuilding and refreshing of all in the divine life. The person is morbid indeed who fails to get blessed under these conditions.

None can afford to miss the rich blessings in store for this meeting. All Christians need this grand uplift. Suppose it does involve a sacrifice it will pay. It is always beneficial to exercise faith—so come with the purpose of being

a blessing to some one, and you are sure to be blessed yourself. If you have money bring some one with you who cannot pay their own way, and you will be shouting happy before you start. If you really cannot come yourself, pay your pastor's or some old persons way as your substitute. Come, and bring your whole family. There is plenty of room for the children and plenty of things to attract their attention.

Look about you and see what you can do to help some one else who needs your help. Some people we know can gather ten persons of their acquaintance and pay their expenses and keep them through the whole meeting, and hardly feel it sufficiently to get a real good blessing. There may be a hard working man or woman in your neighborhood, who has never known what a weeks vacation was—just go over and say: "Look here, I am going to Beulah Camp Meeting, and I want you to go, and I will pay the bill. I want you to enjoy a real good time; come now, get ready and it won't cost you a cent." TRAVELLING RATES.

Rates for Travelling to and from the Alliance and Convention at Beulah Camp Ground from June 28th, 1915.

Via I. C. R.—Purchase one-way first class ticket to St. John, obtaining at the same time a *Standard Certificate*, which when signed by the Secretary at Beulah will entitle you to a free return.

The above applies to the Valley Railway also, as the I. C. R. has charge of it. *But be sure and get a Standard Certificate* when you buy your ticket.

Via C. P. R.—Purchase a first class ticket to St. Marys, Fredericton, or St. John, as you wish, obtaining at the same time a *Standard Certificate*, which when signed by the Secretary at Beulah will entitle you to be returned at one-third first class fare.

Note.—Persons coming from any point in the United States will buy a return ticket to the nearest station in New Brunswick on the C. P. R., then buy a one-way first class ticket from that station to St. Marys, Fredericton or St. John, as they wish, obtaining at the same time a *Standard Certificate*, which when signed by the Secretary at Beulah will entitle the holder to the one-third return fare.

Via D. A. R.—Purchase a first class ticket to St. John, at the same time obtaining a *Standard Certificate*, which when signed by the Secretary will entitle you to a free return; except on the steamer from St. John to Digby, which is controlled by the C. P. R., and subject to their conditions as above stated.

St. John River Steamers.—All persons coming from Fredericton or below as far as Hampstead will buy a return ticket to Beulah Camp Ground, as no certificates will be issued by any of the river steamers. Those coming from St. John to Beulah will pay their fare both ways, as no return tickets are given on any of the steamers between St. John and Beulah. The return tickets from Fredericton to Beulah are \$1.50. The fare from St. John to Beulah is 30 cents each way.

Grand Manan Steamer. — Pay fare to St. John and get a *Certificate of Attendance* from the Secretary at Beulah for a free return.

Notice.—Be sure when purchasing your ticket to ask for a *Standard Certificate* from all railway ticket agents, as only by this being signed by the Secretary at the Camp Ground can you obtain the above reduction in fare on your return. No rebate will be allowed by the railways for your failure to comply with the above conditions.
