Mr. J. F. Bullock of St. John, N. B., will be in charge of the instrumental music.

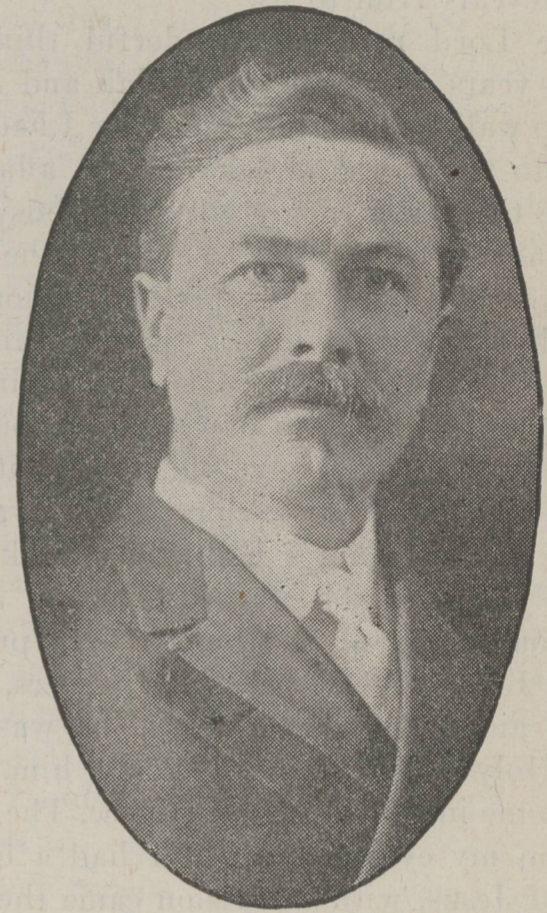

Who will have charge of the services.

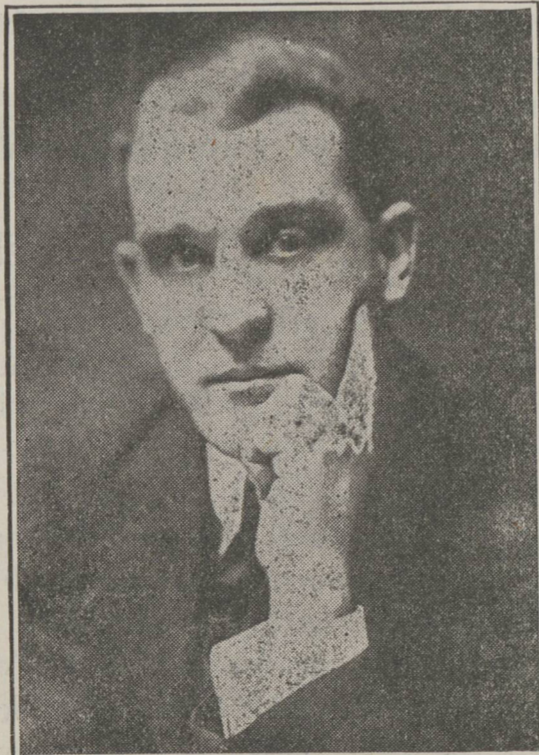


REV. P. J. TRAFTON
Leader of the Singing.

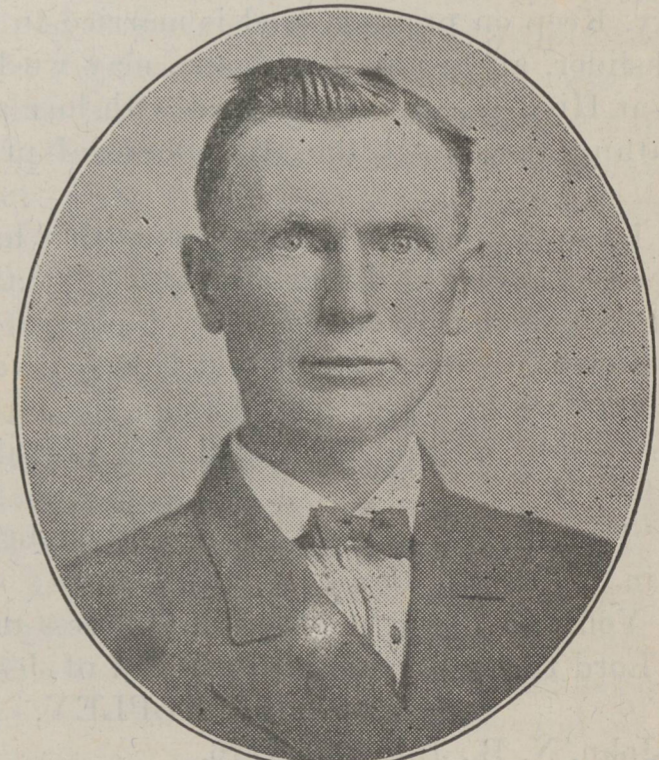
