Should the world for another half-century continue in the same course as it has during the past half century, the topic assigned to me would pass as a joke, for mothers in the full sense of the word will be rare, and in the present day wives (so far as the marriage ceremony is concerned) are many, mothers are comparitively few, so that a large company of women are not included in this topic.

The originator of this topic has left the writer the widest possible field from which to select the class of mothers as within the limits of the article to be submitted, for the term covers every phase of motherhood, as well as to the age of her children, from the infant to grey haired grandmothers, so the task is truly great.

And also to advise mothers will include every influence which affects her personal life, as well as the life of her home, and offspring, for there are many streams of influences which flow into the home life which demands a most wonderful being endowed with great resourcefulness and fine powers of discrimination, with almost superhuman executive ability, combined in that personality that we call mother, and that God has entrusted with the wonderful power of the reproduction of the workmanship of his own hands.
