EDITORIAL.

PROHIBITION IS WORKING WELL.

The great benefit of the prohibitory law which came in force May 1st must be apparent to all, especially in the City of St. John, which has been the base of supply of this base traffic to the greater part of New Brunswick. The police records reveal the great change, where there was a large number arrested every week for drunkenness and the deeds done because of drunkenness, arrests for these causes have almost disappeared.

The stricter enforcement of the "Canada Temperance Act" in the city of Moncton has also resulted in the reduction of arrests for drunkenness until the cases have become rare, and jail sentences held over rum sellers is having a very beneficial effect.

All people who have the best interests of Canada at heart sincerely pray that total prohibition may soon become Dominion wide, and not only so, but world-wide.

RATES FOR TRAVELLING

TO AND FROM THE ALLIANCE AND CAMP MEETING AT

BEULAH CAMP GROUND

JUNE 27th TO JULY 9TH, 1917.

Via I. C. R. and Valley Railway—Purchase a First Class Ticket to St. John, Gagetown, or Fredericton, as you wish, obtaining at the same time a **Standard Certificate**, which when signed by the Secretary at Beulah will entitle you to a free return, provided you purchase your ticket not more than 3 days before the 27th or later than the first three days of the meeting, namely, the 29th of June, which will be Friday of that week. Please do not forget this. You must purchase your ticket on the I. C. R. before Saturday, the 30th of June, in order to return **free.**

Via C. P. R.—Purchase a First Class Ticket to St. Mary's, Fredericton, or St. John, as you wish, obtaining at the same time a **Standard Certificate**, which when signed by the Secretary at Beulah will entitle you to be returned at **One-Third** first class fare.

Note.—Persons coming from any point in the United States will buy a return ticket to the nearest station in New Brunswick on the C. P. R. and then buy a one way first class ticket from that station to St. Mary's, Fredericton or St. John, as they wish, obtaining at the same time a **Standard Certificate**, which when signed by the Secretary at Beulah will entitle the holder to the **One-Third** return fare.

Via the Dominion Atlantic Railway—Purchase a one way first class ticket to St. John via Digby, and be sure to obtain a **Standard Certificate**, at the same time, when signed by the Secretary at Beulah, will entitle you to be returned free.

Grand Manan Steamer—Buy a **Camp Meeting return ticket** from Grand Manan to St. John, which will cost you this year Two Dollars and Five Cents (\$2.05).

The River Steamers from St. John will give no return fare. The "D. J. Purdy" may give some reduction from Fredericton, as it will probably be the only steamer from Fredericton this year, and then only on Tuesdays, Thursdays and Saturdays.

REPORTS OF COMMITTEES.
