

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

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

### EDITORIAL

1917

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THE TWENTY-NINTH ANNUAL SESSION OF THE ALLIANCE OF THE REFORMED BAPTIST CHURCH OF CANADA.

The first meeting of the Alliance was held at Woodstock, N. B., on Nov. 3, 1888. Nearly twenty-nine years has passed into eternity since that memorable day, memorable to a few now remaining of the original company who pledged themselves to follow in the pathway of scriptural holiness, as revealed in the old and new testaments, under the guidance of the Holy Spirit, including an entire consecration of our bodies, souls and spirits, and talents and possessions.

There was a mingling of tears, prayers and songs of praise, and shouts of victory; these have not ceased to be mingled in our meetings for these 29 years. We have met our sorrows, at times feelings of aloneness but the promise, "I will not leave you (orphans) comfortless," has been proven true by the individual, by the churches, and by the Alliance, many, many times. Every time the soul has cried out its dis-

tress, the 'comforter' has responded.

Our conflicts have been many, but our victories have been equal to them for we yet live and we expect that the reports of the churches, including the two churches in Africa, will show as good or better numerical results in conversions and sanctifications during the past year as in any one year since our organization and also our financial showing has probably surpassed or at least kept pace with former years.

Because of the world's great conflict and its consequent sorrow, there is a general depression on the hearts and minds of the people in which we all must share.

While there cannot be great exuberance of joy that at times is manifested at camp meetings, there can be something deeper, richer, grander, in deep spiritual unity and sacred fellowship, where all matters pertaining to salvation unto life eternal can be considered, and effective methods of work devised and carried out under the leadership of the Holy Spirit.

The object of the Alliance is first to carry on Christian work that requires united effort and combined financial support, as Missions, Camp Meetings and the publication of a paper advocating the principles we represent.

Second, to consider questions that are of mutual interest among the churches and for mutual protection from false doctrines and false teachers, and those who would seek a following for themselves with personal and selfish ends in view.

Third, for mutual benefit in spiritual life and a united force against the power of evil, and because that the natural result of Christian life is unity.

In coming together let us turn away from all local and personal difficulties, and fix our minds on that which is worthy of the sons and daughters of our great and merciful God and Saviour Jesus Christ, and our high calling in Christ Jesus and with one heart strive for advancement of the cause of holiness.
