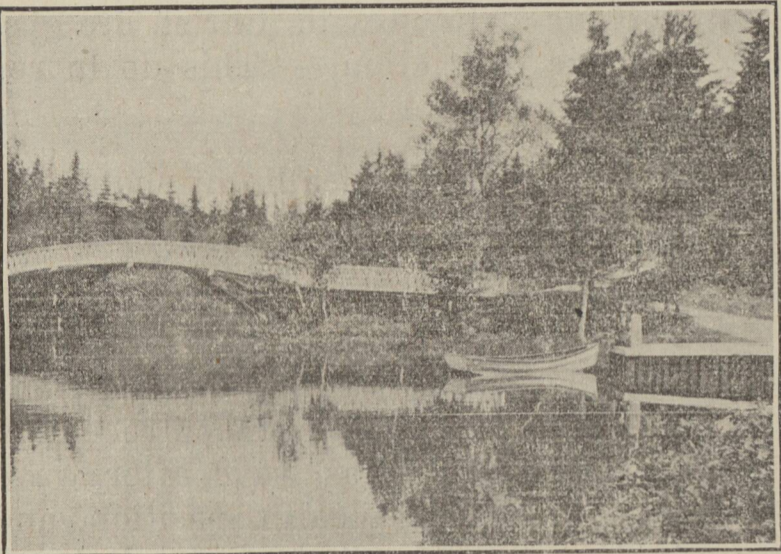

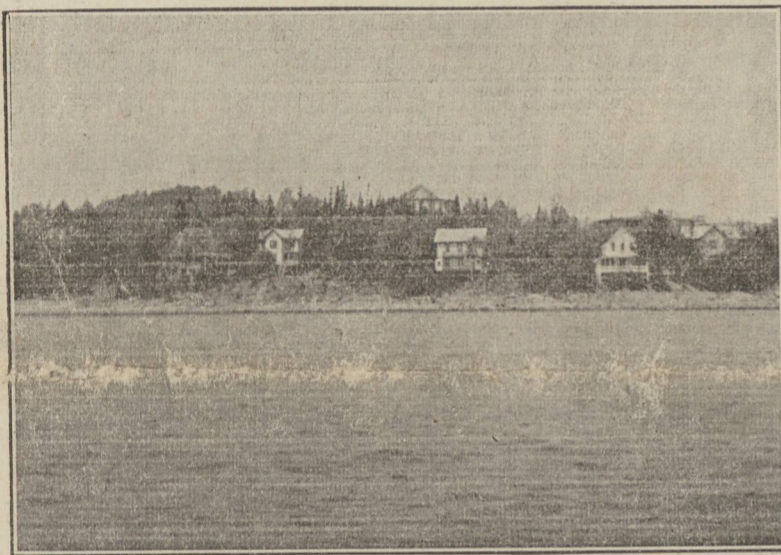
Views of Beulah Camp Ground.



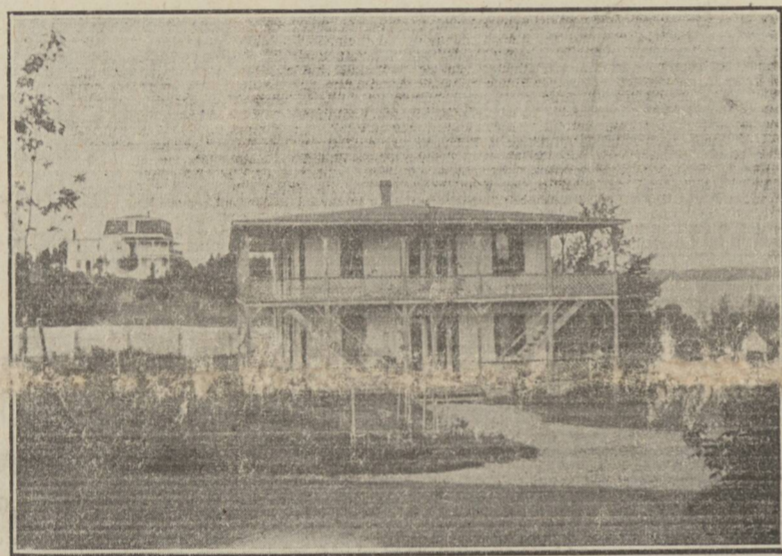
Foot Bridge on Artificial Lake.

THE LATEST FROM DR. SANDERS.

Paulpietersburg, Natal, Dec. 14, 1916.
Dear Brother Baker:

Many thanks for the monies cabled, and news of which reached me yesterday. I was at P. P. B. town at the time I got the note from my bank, and forthwith consulted the agents who are conveyancers, etc. They advise me to wait for full power of attorney to buy not only surface rights, but freehold. I have written deeds, office, etc., and have full information as to title of Balmoral, etc.

The Bank advises the arrival of £792, which is more than \$3,800. The commissions will be subtracted, leaving the full amount you intended. I can tell you exactly when my accounts come in. Will inclose receipt.
