

















"AS SURE AS DEATH."

And of that judgment it is written—"For God shall bring every work into judgment, with every sercet thing" (Eccl. xii. 14). Yes, the secret sins of men, their midnight deeds, unknown to their fellows, but well known to the All-seeing God.
