BOARD AT THE CAMP MEETINGS.

On account of the great advance in the prices of all kinds of provisions, the Alliance Executive have decided that a raise in the price of board at the Camp Meetings is inevitable, and yet it will be very low compared to board elsewhere. Last year the board was placed at \$3.50 per week, and Beulah Hotel did not pay the expenses. This season all food stuff is very much higher. So to clear the expenses we have decided to set the prices as follows: Per week \$4.50; per day \$1.00; single meals, dinner 50 cents; breakfast and supper 35 cents. Our ministers and their wives \$2.00 per week. Their children under 12 years old \$1.00 per week. Ministers belonging to the Alliance will have their rooms free as usual.

All can easily see that our only object is to pay the running expenses.

There will be good provisions made for those who wish to board themselves during the meetings.
