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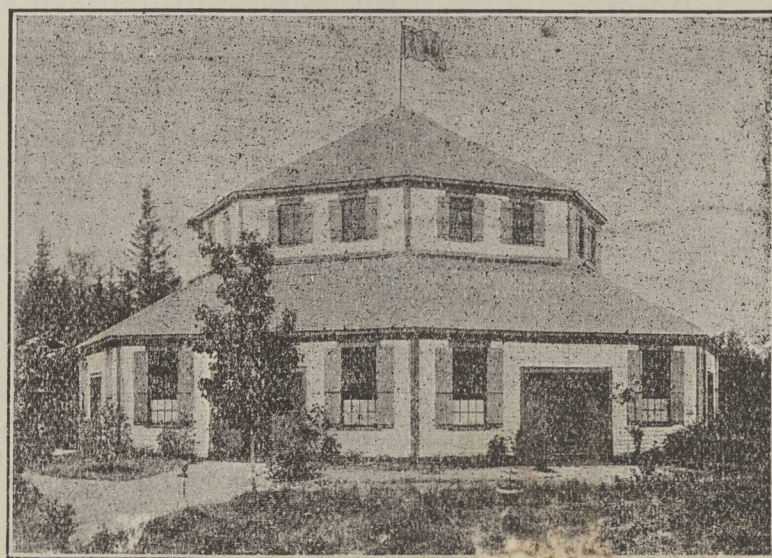

People can board themselves if they wish, everything in food can be purchased. Milk and other farm products are brought to the grounds for sale. There is a daily mail and telephone connection, and daily steamboat service with St. John and a tri-weekly service with Fredericton. All river steams and boats call at the wharf. Come and bring your family and stay through the meeting. A week at Beulah Camp Meeting is a refreshing physically and spiritually that stays with those who go.

Beulah Camp Meeting is not a money making enterprise. Money must be had for running expenses, and for keeping the buildings and grounds in repair. We have not considered the question of interest on the money invested. It is property consecrated to the service of God as all churches should be. And is not to be devoted to any other purpose. Hence it is not a worldly pleasure resort, and will not be used as such. It is a place of worship, but does not exclude the innocent play of the children, nor any enjoyment, that is in harmony with a devoted Christian life. It is our purpose for people to have a chance to breathe God's pure atmosphere, physically, morally, spiritually, "against which there is no law."

Beulah Camp Meeting is not strictly a denominational meeting, and is not held for denominational ends. This meeting stands for, and strongly advocates the two great essential
