POINTED PARAGRAPHS.

The Holy Spirit alone can convince, convict, convert, and sanctify a soul, and make it fit for heaven.

An otherwise strong preacher reveals his weak point when he substitutes nerveracking and overdrawn anecdotes for the Holy Spirit to bring conviction for sin to an intelligent congregation.

People who rush to the altar from the effect of some highly sensational or horrible anecdote, held on them by the preacher until their feelings are all stirred up, know absolutely nothing of the convicting power of the Holy Spirit for their sins.

The Holy Spirit can horrify a person, by revealing to him his awful sinful life, or condition, and thus bring him to true and lasting repentance.

We fear sometimes that more effort is made to get people to the altar for the glory of the worker, than is made to get people to Christ for His glory alone. Humanity at its best estate is exceedingly weak, it is so hard to divest it of self or self-interest, self-seeking and self-ease. No wonder Paul said: "For we that are in this tabernacle do groan, being burdened; not for that we would be unclothed, but clothed upon, that mortality might be swallowed up of life." Nothing really satisfies, but "the more abundant life."

Jesus said: "He shall take of mine and shew it unto you." When one is right with God, what holy awe he experiences as the Holy Spirit is revealing the things of Christ to him. If wrong before God, what awful conviction and anguish seizes him as he discovers himself by the light of the Word revealed to him by the Holy Spirit. Let us preach the word with the Holy Ghost sent down from heaven, and we will need no substitutes to convict nor convert men.

"Ye shall know the truth, and the truth shall make you free." No false notion, nor false doctrine, ever made a man free from sin. Sin needs Divine light to locate it, and reveal its fatal nature, and only Divine power can destroy it, and cleanse it from the soul. Sin is a supernatural power, and needs a supernatural remedy.

TESTS—HELPFUL OR INJURIOUS.

Many tests put to people at camp meetings and other revival services have no authority nor backing in the Bible. Their wisdom and effect are open to question. Some are harmless and can be used to find out certain things an evangelist might wish to know, and may at times help some one over a particular point.
