RIVERSIDE CAMP GROUND.

Riverside Camp Ground is situated near Robinson Station on the Bangor & Aroostook Railroad, about two miles from the base of Mars Hill.

Riverside Camp Ground is centrally located, only one quarter of a mile from Robinson Village, five miles from Bridgewater Village, two miles from Blaine, three miles from Mars Hill Village, three miles from Bairds Mills, N.B., six

mile's from Tracy's Mills, N. B., eight miles from Centreville, N. B. This ensures a good attendance through the week.
