BEULAH CAMP MEETING.

The 26th Annual Camp Meeting, which closed on the 6th inst. at Beulah Camp Ground, was one of the best, if not the best ever held there. Everything seemed to combine to make it most enjoyable and profitable in spiritual and temporal blessing. Never was Beulah more beautiful; the weather was perfect from beginning to end, just enough rain to add to the beauty of everything with refreshing showers. The attendance throughout was large, about all the rooms in all the buildings and cottages being filled all the time, and all the available places in and out of the grounds were crowded to the fullest limit over the week ends. The order about the grounds was all that could be desired, even when the overflow crowds were present on Sundays.
