QUARTERLY MEETING.

The quarterly meeting of District No. 1, convened with the church at Meductic, June 12-15, 1919.

On Thursday evening the opening service was led by Bro. Keirstead; Friday evening Bro. P. J. Trafton had charge of the preaching service.

Saturday morning a Testimony Meeting was led by Bro. Wiggins. At this service the speaker showed to the people the value of witnessing; it was a grand meeting.

Saturday afternoon at 2.30 the business meeting was held. The ministers present were: Revs. E. W. Lester, H. S. Dow, P. J. Trafton, W. B. Wiggins, I. F. Keirstead, F. T. Wright and S. A. Baker.

The minutes of the last quarter were read and approved. The following officers were elected: Rev. H. S. Dow, president; M. W. Tompkins, secretary; W. B. Wiggins, Highway Agent; Fred Bragdon, treasurer.

The following delegates were present: Bro. and Sister Ziba Orser from Hartland; Bro. and Sister Blaney, Maple Ridge; Sister Wiggins and Sister Mutch, Woodstock; Bro. and Sister Silas Burtt, Royalton; Bros. Willie Somers and D. Nixon, Victoria Corner; Bros. Allen Dow and Fred Bragdon, Meductic; Bro. David Tompkins, Greenbush; Bro. L. S. Kinney and Sister E. Higgins, Fort Fairfield.

A letter was received from Bro. Coy, stating that his health was poor and therefore could not be present. He requested an interest in the prayers of the people.

The Woodstock church reported their prayer and covenant meetings well attended, and God's care over the entire membership through the epidemic. This church is distinctively missionary in spirit, making a contribution of \$419.85 to the work. The Sunday School is of its usual efficiency.

The church at Royalton reports that they are still alive, and have been helped much by the labors of Bro. Wright, who has come to their assistance since the first of the year.

Fredericton church reported that they were continuing in the way, meeting with more or less opposition from the outside. The Sunday services are well attended. The church has raised more for missions this year than any other since its organization.

Maple Ridge reports the church sustaining two prayer meetings a week, besides the Sunday services. There are some good Christian people in the community who are not members of the church, and they are appreciated very much.

Hartland church reports the work still going on. Bro. Trafton has resigned, and Bro. H. C. Mullen will take his place. The church is sustaining a loss in the moving away of Bro. Trafton's family, and also Bro. James Rogers' family, but we must say the will of the Lord be done.

The interest in the Marysville circuit is good. The church at Marysville has been undergoing repairs and is about completed; the financial end will be practically met when the work is done.

At Fort Fairfield the interest is fairly good; the Sunday school could be improved.

Bro. Nixon reported victory for the work at Victoria Corner; they have their regular meetings.

The work on the Meductic circuit has greatly improved under the labors of Bro. Dow.

The work is very good on the Millville circuit.

An invitation was given to Bro. and Sister Killecollins to participate in the business deliberations of the meeting.

A resolution was passed "that we as a quarterly meeting highly commend Bro. Dow in his wisdom and earnest efforts in the successful completion of this beautiful little church edifice at Meductic, and we hope that he may continue in the good and successful work at Meductic and all over the circuit."

The Devotional Committee was made up of Bros. Kinney, Tompkins, Burtt and H. S. Dow.

A vote of thanks was given to the people of Meductic for their kindness in entertaining the meeting.

Resolved that the next Quarterly Meeting convene at Victoria Corner, Sept. 4th.

The meeting then adjourned. Prayer was offered by Bro. Wright.

Sunday morning the "Love Feast" began at nine o'clock. Bro. Wright spoke a few minutes from the 112th Psalm. This was a grand service. Rev. S. A. Baker preached the dedicatory sermon at eleven o'clock; the report of that service has already been given.

Bro. Wiggins preached at the afternoon service and gave a grand sermon on the benefits of the Pentecostal experience.

Rev. P. J. Trafton spoke in the evening.

A number manifested a desire to be prayed for. This was a grand meeting throughout. The offerings and pledges of the day amounted to approximately five hundred dollars. To God be all the glory. Amen!
