#### EDITORIAL.

## AND ABOVE ALL THESE THINGS PUT ON CHARITY, WHICH IS THE BOND OF PERFECTNESS.

It will do us all good to read carefully, and prayerfully, and meditate upon the third chapter of the epistle to the Colossians.

Oh, how we need a gentle kindly spirit toward each other, and toward all men.

Even after we get salvation, we need so much teaching and molding and mellowing by the word, and by the Holy Spirit.

It seems to us that we see the need of the baptism "with the Holy Ghost and fire" upon the children of God, and the ministry more than ever before; and the word "fire" takes on the idea of warmth and gentleness of love, brotherly kindness, taking off the hard edge that wounds and cuts and bruises and hurts, and overcoming those things that appear to us as defects in our brethren. We should stop and think, and ask the question, Who is it that reveals to us the weaknesses, and delinguencies of our brethren? and possibly hides from us our own. We must remember there is one that is designated as "the accuser of the brethren," who has the power to "transform himself into an angel of light," whose business is to oppose Christ, and to destroy confidence, peace, and harmony, everywhere, in nations, communities, homes and churches. hates peace and harmony. A harsh censorious spirit is not of God. It is contrary to the teaching of the word. Flint and steel coming into quick contact will strike fire. We do not for a moment mean by this that we should have a compromising, condoning way that is as soft and useless as a jelly fish. We may be a person of sense, and keen and quick comprehension, but full of love, and under control, that can suffer long and be kind, and bear the things that displease us. "Love suffereth long and is kind."

"Put on therefore, as the elect of God, holy and beloved, bowels of mercies, kind-

ness, humbleness of mind, meekness, long-suffering;

Forbearing one another, and forgiving one another, if any man have a quarrel (a complaint) against any, even as Christ forgave you, so also do ye."

"And above all these," put on the girdle of love.

"Oh! I believe," says a brother, "if we have what we profess we will, have nothing to suffer long with each other about nor to forbear with one another about, and will not have any complaints, and there will be nothing to forgive."

But, brother, if there was a photographer there when you said that, to take your picture, and phonograph to have taken your tone of voice, and you could have the privilege of seeing and hearing yourself, you would want to modify the expression of your face, and take the fighting tone out of your voice.

For if another had been present in a like condition as you manifested, you would as Christians shake hands before you part, and say, brother, I am sorry I spoke just that way; I did not mean to sound nor act just as I did. Forgive me.

Hold on, hold on. Paul knew these Colossian brethren were yet in the body, still having defective judgments, subject to all the infirmities of people still in the body, who look at things from different view points, with all the varities found in a company of people, with all the degrees of knowledge or lack of knowledge, and he knew they, and all succeeding generations of people would need these admonitions.

Paul said these people were dead (to sin) and their life was hid with Christ in God (V. 3) yet told them what they should put off and what they should put on as the elect of God.

If we possess these blessed heaven born qualities, and graces, let us use them on all occasions during this new year. If we lack any of the graces let us go humbly before God and ask him to double our spiritual capital, and we will enjoy the most blessed year of our life, and doubtless reap the largest harvest of precious souls.

## SAFE ONLY ON YOUR KNEES.

Principal George Adam Smith tells a tale of how, in his early Alpine-climbing days, he was climbing one of the Swiss Alps on the sheltered side. Though they did not know it, a great wind was blowing, and as they climbed to the topmost crag, the guide, who had been leading the way upwards, stepped back, as was his wont, that the traveller might have his foot first upon the top. Dr. Smith sprang to the top of the peak and was almost blown back over the edge by the wind. The guide seized him and brought him down to his knees, crying in his ear: "Down!
