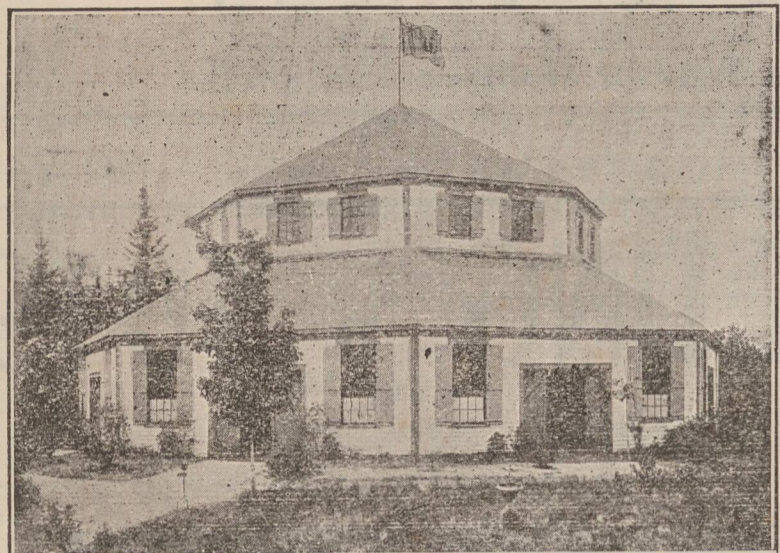

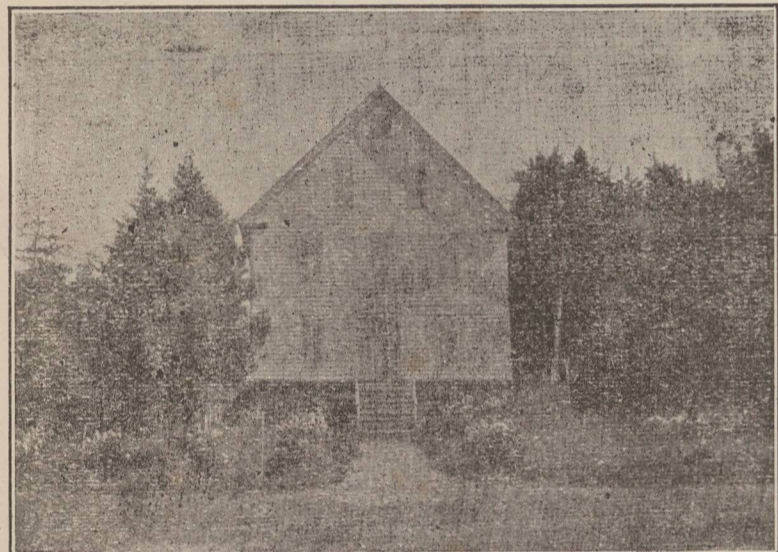

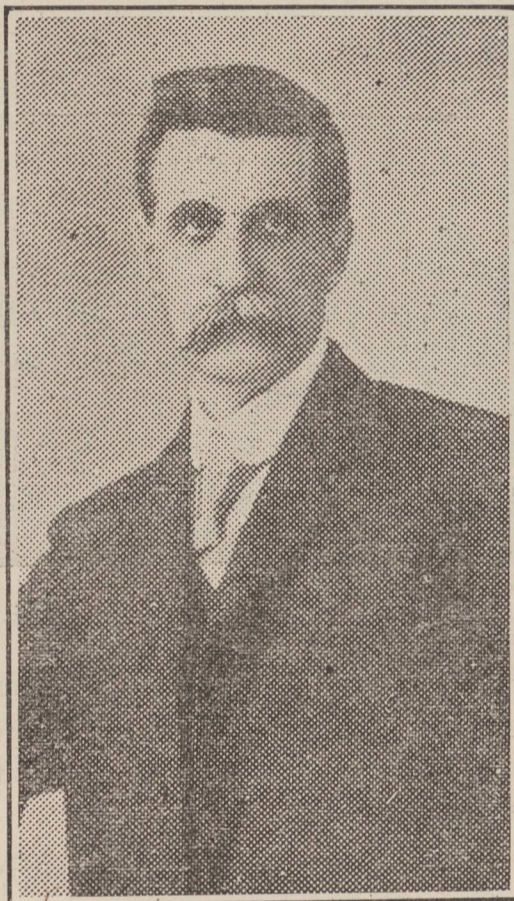
BEULAH HOTEL

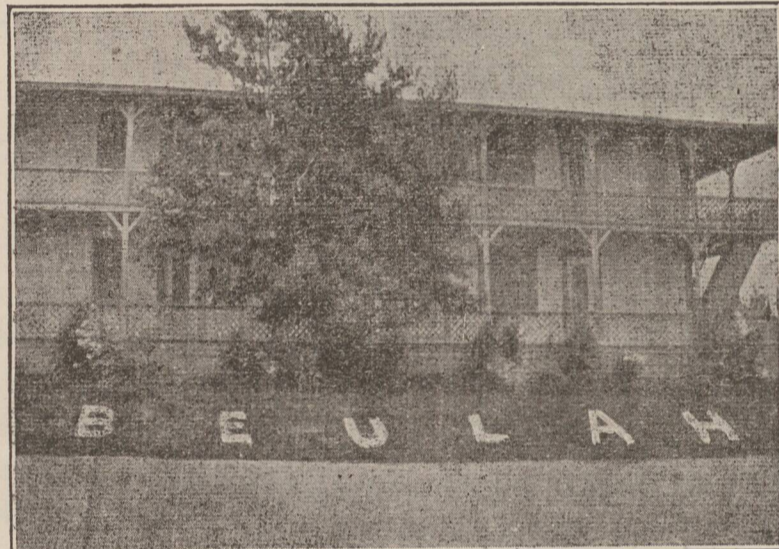
CEDARDALE DORMITORY

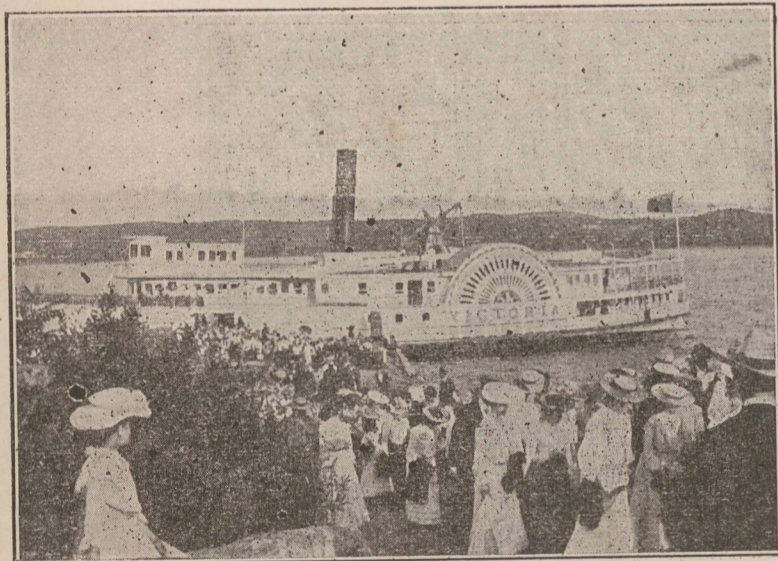

FILLED WITH THE HOLY SPIRIT.
