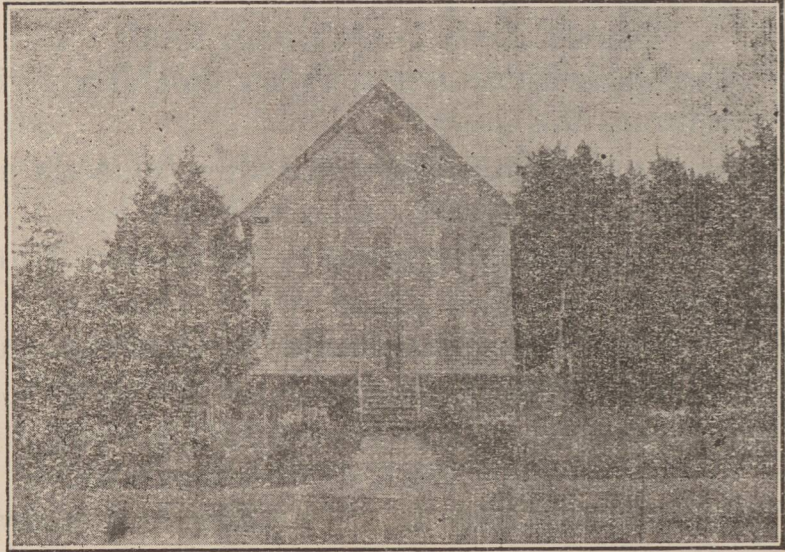

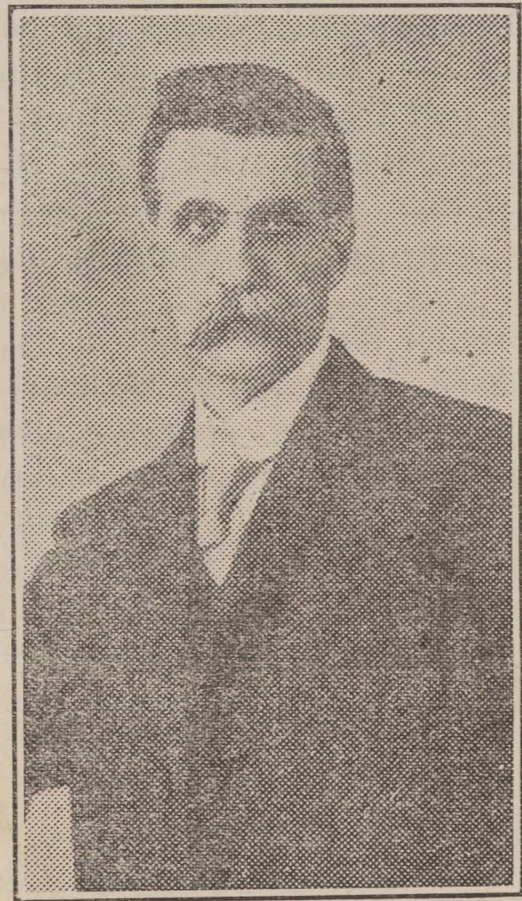
BEULAH HOTEL

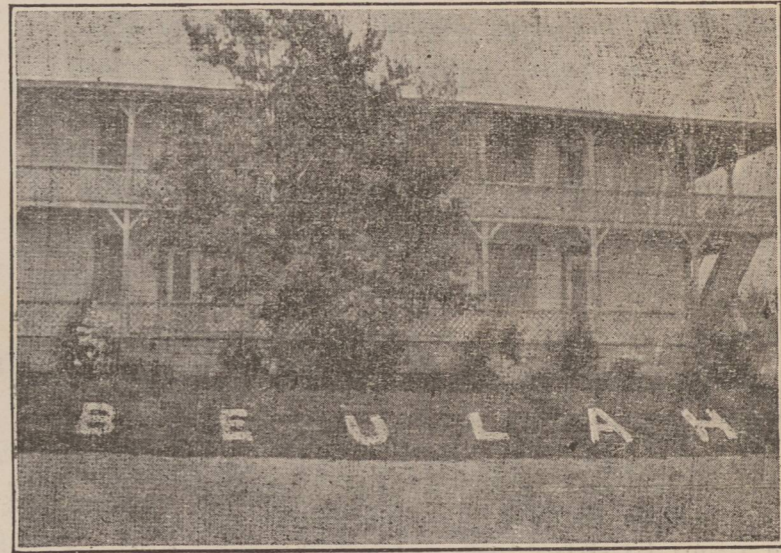
CEDARDALE DORMITORY

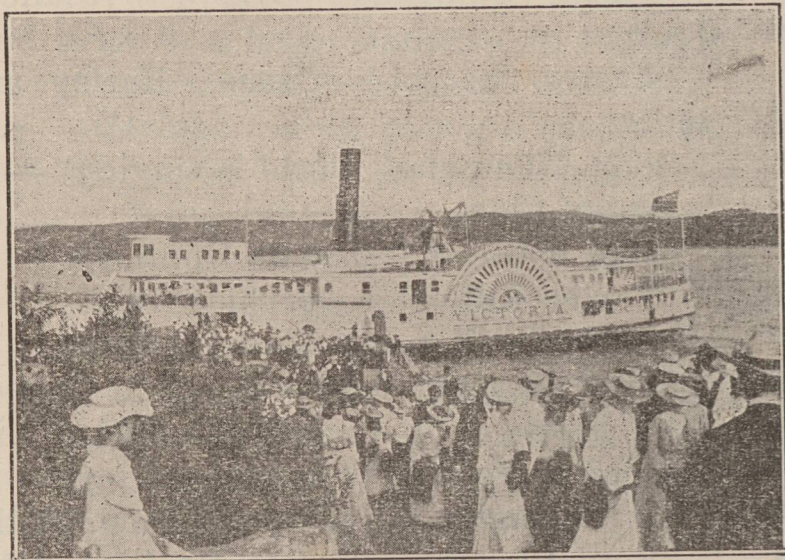

HOW WESLEY PROVED INSPIRATION.

John Wesley gives one of the shortest arguments for the inspiration of the Scriptures and a good one withal. His statement is original and strong and terse, like its great author. We give it here for the benefit of others:

"I beg leave to propose a short, clear, and strong argument to prove the divine inspiration of the Holy Scriptures.

"The Bible must be the invention either of good men or angels, bad men or

devils, or of God.

"1. It could not be the invention of good men or angels, for they neither would nor could make a book and tell lies all the time they were writing it, saying: 'Thus saith the Lord,' when it was their own invention.

"2. It could not be the invention of bad men or devils, for they could not make a book which commands all duty, forbids all sins, and condemns their own souls to hell for all eternity.

"Therefore, draw the conclusion that the Bible must be given by divine inspiration."—Selected.

"Years ago General Booth made the following statement: 'I am of the opinion that the chief dangers which confront the coming century will be religion without the Holy Spirit; Christianity without Christ; forgiveness without repentance; salvation without regeneration; politics without God; and heaven without hell.'"
