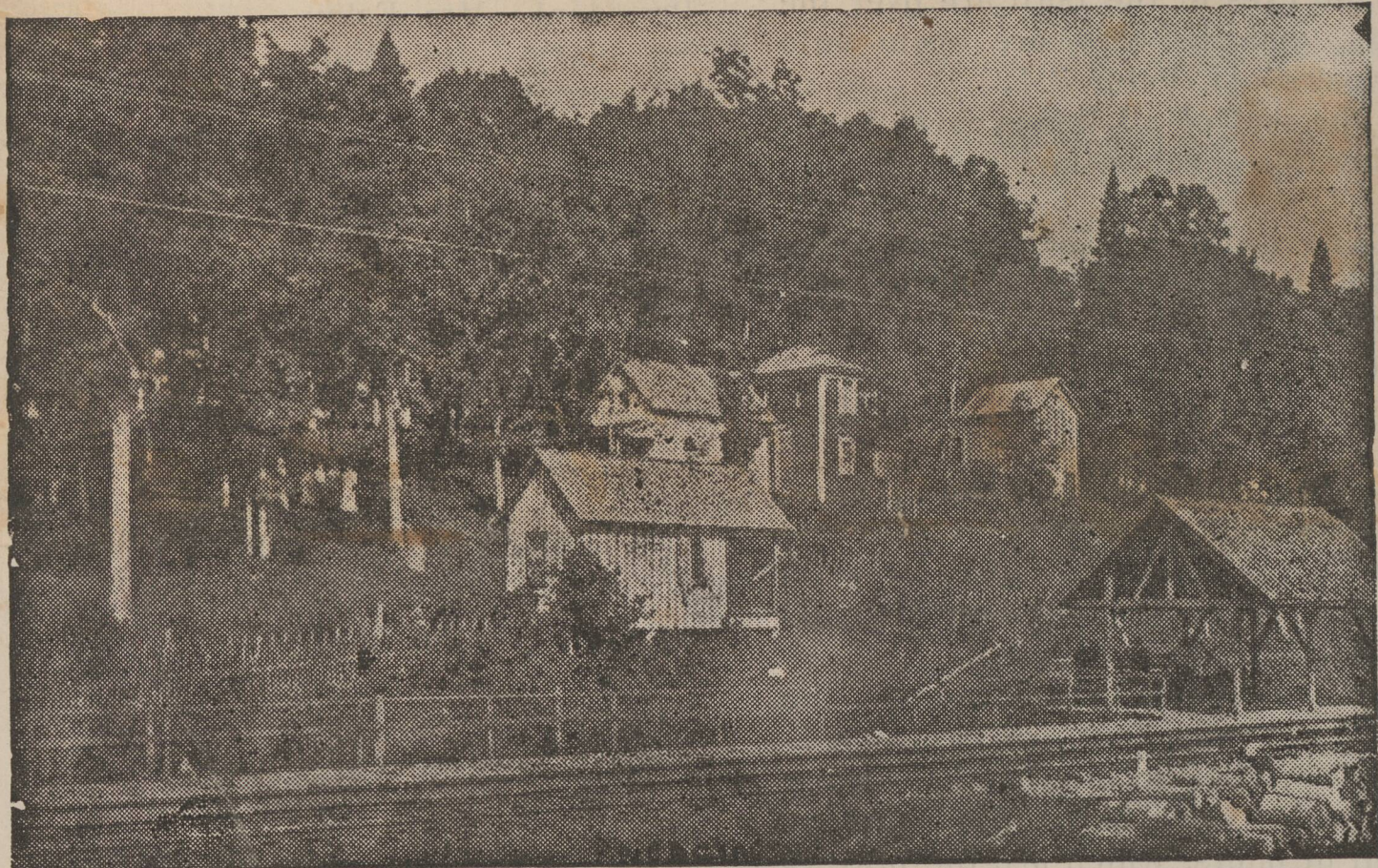

There are no special rates on the Railroads. Buy return tickets.

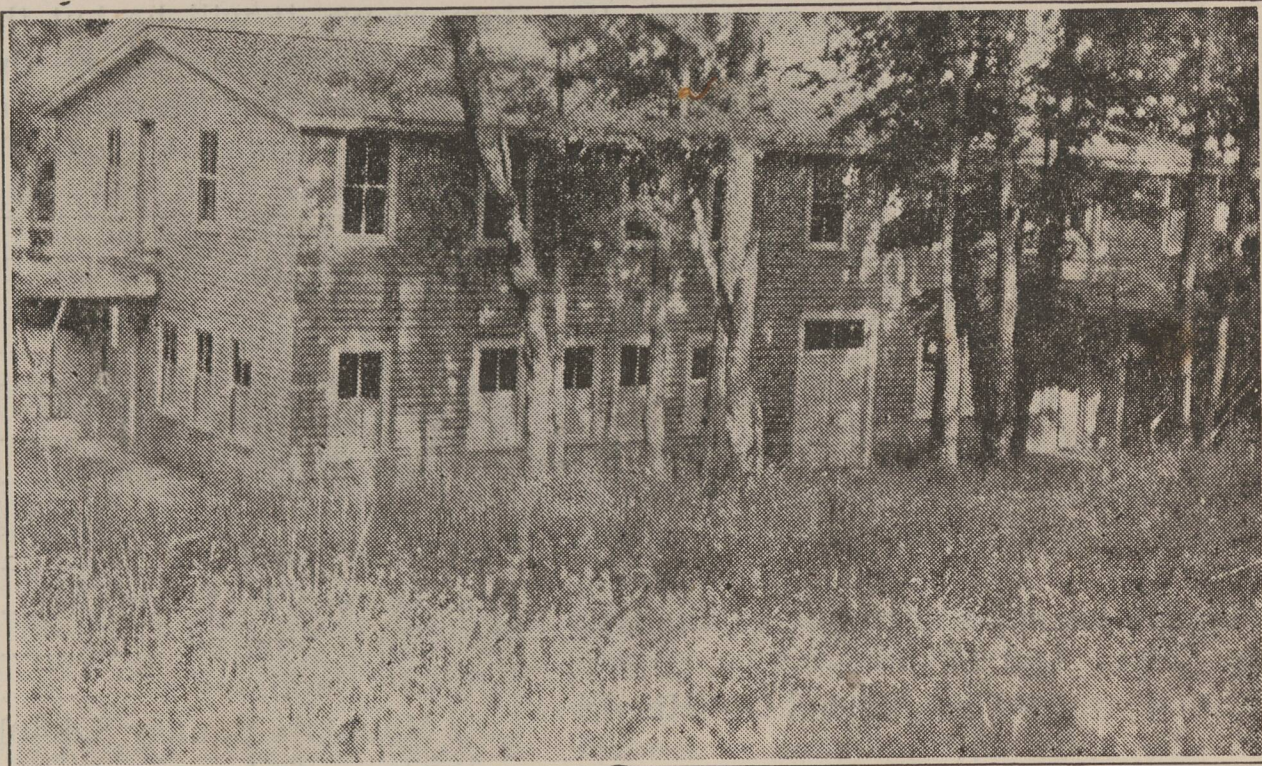
