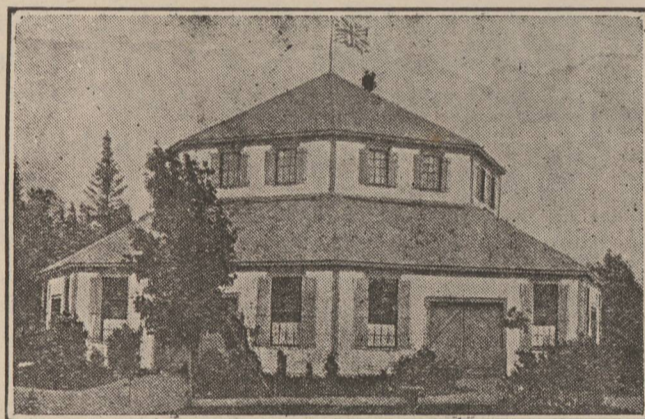

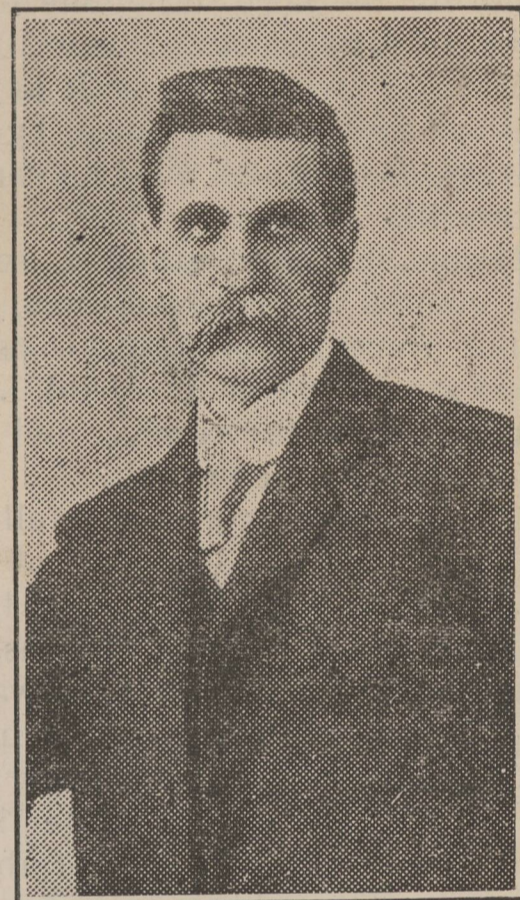


BEULAH TABERNACLE.

This Should Be The Greatest Camp Meeting

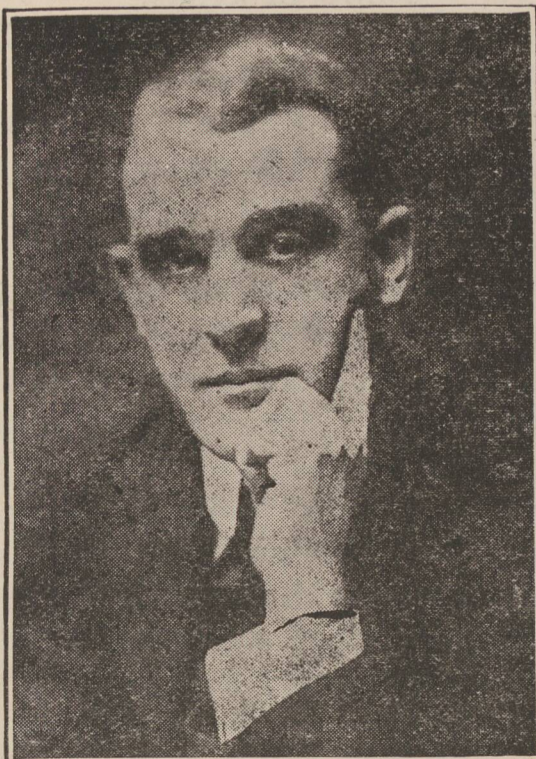
