For when they shall say, Peace and safety; then sudden destruction cometh upon—and they shall not escape.


But ye, brethren, are not in darkness, that that day should overtake you as a thief.

A word of explanation—Up to the landing of our sisters in Africa, their expenses have been provided for, independent of our regular missionary funds, raised by our missionary societies, and we believe we should follow on this line of independent provision for them, so far as our regular funds, that is, those funds coming from the regular work of our missionary societies, previous to the Sterritt sisters becoming missionaries.

Our new proposal.

This should go with a rush, because it is within the reach of even the boys and girls in our Sunday School classes, as well as the men and women, viz., by the gift of 10 cents per week by 200 persons their salaries can be provided and \$40 to good in 52 weeks.

We can have these two hundred names easily inside of one month if every pastor and church will act immediately and put it through to a finish.

A considerable number will want to pay their Five Dollars immediately. All right, let them do so; others will want to take a larger share and will want to pay \$10, \$15, \$20, \$25, or \$50 or \$100. Good! Splendid! Come on.

This will be stimulating to the Sunday School classes, and to the churches and a blessing to all who help.

Do this without interfering with any other department of our work.

The money can be sent to the treasurer which is paid in immediately so the treasurer will have money for the next quarterly payment of their salaries, as we pay our foreign missionary salaries quarterly. That which is gathered in small amounts can be sent in monthly. The missionary treasurer in each church can look after the money and send it to the general treasurer, or a special one can be appointed.

Now we would like a list of the contributors for publication in the Highway.

Those who wish to pay the full amount of their contribution can send it direct to the general treasurer, and we will acknowledge it in the Highway.

Send your money by postal note, post office money order or registered letter. (If you send cheques add 10 cents for bank charges.)
