#### EDITORIAL.

"Unto you is born this day in the City of David a Saviour which is Christ the Lord." Luke 2:11.

### CHRISTMAS GREETINGS:

The year is coming to its close, and we all are looking forward to Christmas. How many have been the mercies and blessings we have enjoyed during this year! Amidst them all have we thought of the One, through whose love we have enjoyed them, I fear many make Christmas, a time of selfish gratification, and do not once think of the gracious loving Redeemer whose advent into the world it celebrates. Although the advent of Jesus Christ had for hundreds of years been pretold by the phophets, yet how few seemed to be looking for Him when he came. There was, no doubt, a general expectation among the Jewish people; but it was a vague and undefined idea. When the wise men visited Jerusalem they did not find the chief priests and scribes very much interested in the coming "King of the Jews." And even in Bethlehem there was no room for him or his parents in the inn. True, there were a few, like Simeon and Anna who were earnestly and faithfully looking and longing for "redemption in Israel." The many had often heard or even read the prophesies, but had not prayerfully studied them, and had but very little real interest in them. This seems strange to us. But is it any more strange than the fact that since he has come, the many professed Christians do not prayerfully study his words, His works, and His spirit to learn of Him. So few desire to really know Him in his fulness. Is it not so? But he has come, and come to save us from our sins; to take away the sin of the world. Both the church and the world have recognized the significance of this advent. The rites and ceremonials af Judaism have given way to the truths and doctrines of the gospel of Christ. Those who had been looking to Him through types and shadows, as in a glass, now have the privilege of seeing Him face to face, and drinking in His gracious words and imbibing His loving

Spirit. The gospel is now, the power of God unto salvation to every one who believeth, both Jew and Gentile. He is the Rock upon which the Church is to be founded, and against which the gates of Hell shall not pervail. Its worship is to be, no longer in carnal ordinances, but "in spirit and truth."

Christ's advent was the greatest epoch in the world-history; yet it "knew Him not." We therefore send a Christmas greeting to all our readers, and desire that each may not only have a Merry Christmas in the sense of having worldly joys and comforts; but that each may have a fulness of joy, in a spiritual sense, because the blood of Jesus Christ has cleansed each heart from all sin, and each have received the baptism of the Holy Ghost, the fulfillment of His promise.

KNOWING THIS.

(Continued from page one) his heart became puffed up, a victim to pride and open disobedience to the words of God through the prophet Samuel. "Pride goeth before a fall." One of the seven things which is an abomination to the Lord is "a proud look." Pro. 6:17. Pride manifests itself in immodest dress, worldly attire not suited to warmth, neatness, modesty and hygiene. Pride is often the cause of violent discord. Most of church schisms may be attributed to pride, which occasions desire for leadership, etc. "Oh, why should the spirit of mortal be proud?" Let him that would be greatest be servant of all." "If I then, your Lord and Master, have washed your feet (a most menial service), ye also ought to wash one another's feet." And yet men may literally do this and have much pride in the heart." Some take pride in their plain attire. Only the blood of Jesus can purge out the roots of pride. The devil fell through pride.

VII. Unholy ambition. Before Pentecost the disciples were guilty of revenge, unholy ambition, sectarian bigotry and cowardice, resulting in their humiliation; but thank God they tarried at Jerusalem till the Holy Ghost fell on them; and this promise "is unto you, and to your children, and to all that are afar off.' Peter declared God "put no difference between us (Jews) and them (Gentiles), purifying their hearts by faith." Acts 15:9. God does radical things which prove out in every day life. Either the old man of sin is dead in the heart, purged out, or he is not dead. The entire character of the apostles was changed at Pentecost, as was that of Jacob by the brook Jabbok. With the old man in the heart the inner battle continues; but "there remaineth a rest to the people of God."

Beloved, cross over into Beulah land today. Jesus wills your entire sanctification. "Faithful is he that calleth you, who also will do it." He suffered "without the gate that he might sanctify the people with his own blood."

"Now O my Joshua, bring me in, Cast out thy foes ; the inbred sin, The carnal mind remove; The purchase of thy death divide! And O! with all the sanctified Give me a heart of love."
