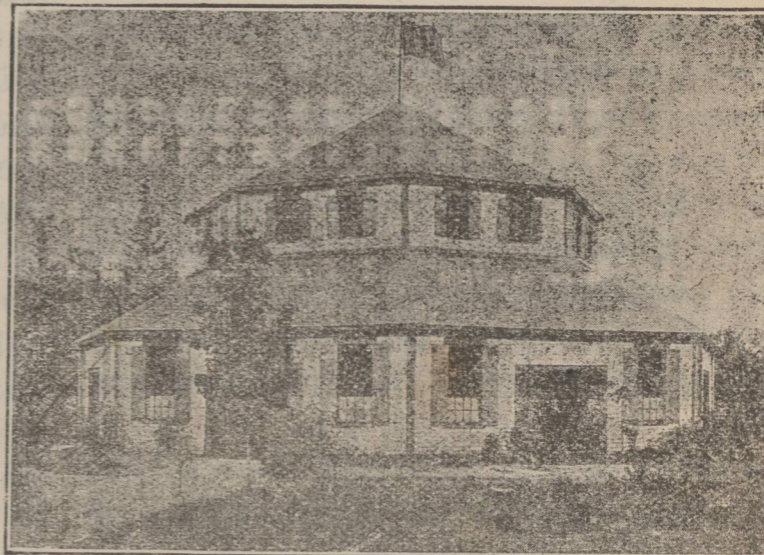
These camp meetings are purely evan-
