

REVIVAL AT BEALS, MAINE.

It becomes my duty as well as privilege to report our meetings at Beals. We began on Oct. 18th with Rev. H. S. Mullen as evangelist, and continued till Sunday night, Dec. 9th, taking out of this time two nights only as rest nights. On Nov. 3rd Brother Mullen's wife joined us and remained until Dec. 2nd. Matthew also tells of the wise men from the east, who appeared on the streets of Jerusalem saying, "Where is He that is born King of the Jews?" These men were of noble bearing, and the dignity of the astrologer, and caused a great deal of commotion among the people. It is no wonder that Herod, the king, was troubled, for they asked a strange question. They were divinely led by the star, till it came and stood over where the young child lay, "and they fell down and worshipped Him; and when they had opened their treasures, they presented unto Him gifts: gold, and frankincense and myrrh." Thus we see they were the first Gentile worshippers.

Mark tells of his ministry, healing the sick, raising the dead, feeding the multitudes, of the Transfiguration, and of His triumphal entry into Jerusalem.

All of the four Gospels tell of the awful tragedy of the Cross, and of His re surrection, showing that He was divine: and then of the ascension. Jesus was God manifest in the flesh. He came to reveal God's love to the world, but had He remained, only a few of the world's millions could have known Him, so the Holy Spirit came to reveal Jesus to individual hearts.
