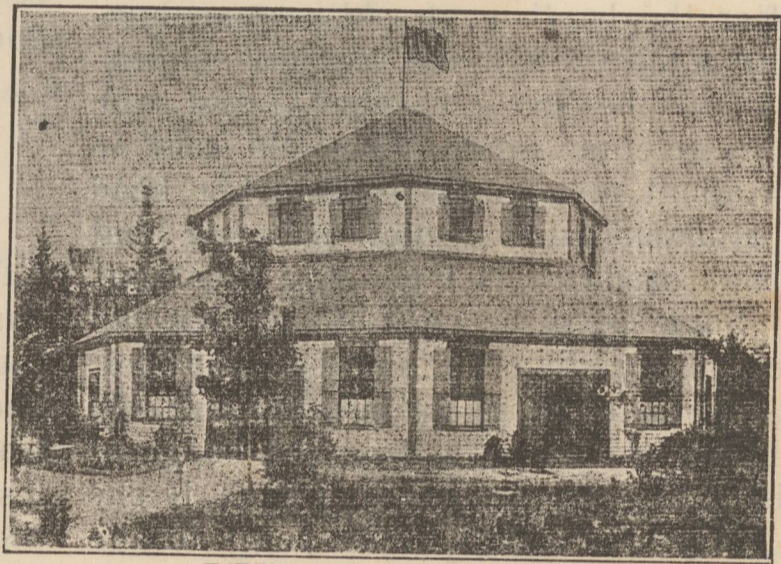

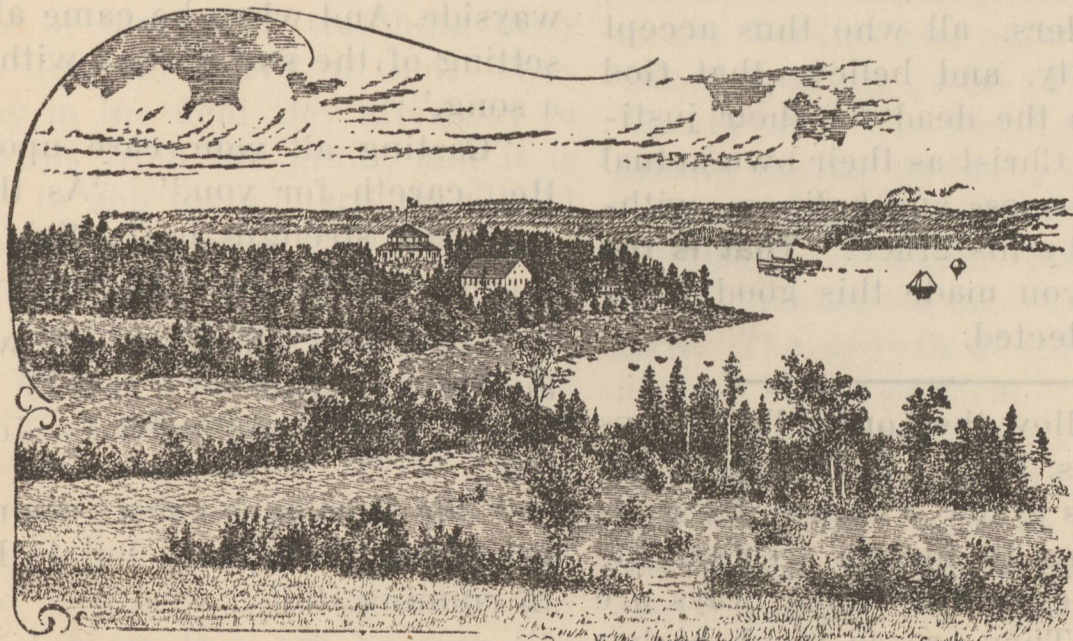
Purchase Return Tickets which will save much trouble and entitle you to remain a month. The railway station is called "**Grand View**" and is on the "Valley Railway."
