A wonderful season of refreshing has been enjoyed in the Reformed Baptist Church in Salem during the past seven weeks. Beginning July 13th, Brother and Sister Fred Kierstead and niece, Emma Keirstead, of Presque Isle, Maine, held revival services for about four weeks, during which the Lord wonderfully blessed and about a hundred souls were saved. Three baptismal services were held during this time, one July 27th and one August 3rd with nine candidates each time, and another August 5th, a beautiful sunset service with seven candidates, making twenty-five in all at that time. The evangelist was then obliged to return home though all felt that the work was incomplete. Sister Emma Kierstead remained and a few more meetings were held while the Praying Band, organized August 3rd, also got into working order.

On Aug. 21st, Brother Kierstead returned unexpectedly, literally sent back by the Lord, and Brother and Sister T. C. Deeves, of Presque Isle, also came to help and especially, as it seemed to bear witness of the power of God to heal. Sister Deeves' testimony of how she was instantly raised from her death bed in answer to prayer, after the doctor had said one lung was all gone (and even her chest had fallen in) and the other lung was badly affected and she had but a day or two more to live, was truly inspiring. During this last week one sister who had a cancer has been prayed with and has seen all soreness, swelling and inflammation disappear while at the same time the Lord blessed her with a wonderful touch of his power. Another sister, lame for years, limps no longer. A brother who was prayed for seems in danger of defeat. Please pray that God's will be done in his case.

However, the healing of the body is as nothing to the healing of sick souls. During this last week the number saved has

been added to, making a total of about 180.

Meanwhile, those who started earlier in the meetings have been gaining strength, learning more of the Master's service, many of them have become soul-winners and the testimony services are a veritable joy to the soul. One young man is already planning to go into some sort of gospel work and some others show promise of being useful in the Master's vineyard.

The services, all through, have been a wonderful time of blessing and of convicting power and a real burden for the salvation of souls. God's people have asked and He has wonderfully answered. All glory be to His holy and blessed name.

A fourth baptism was held on August 31st when four more were buried with Christ. It was thought that this would be the last, but the Lord so wonderfully blessed in the service that night that with eighteen more giving their hearts to God and some of them asking how they could find a way to obey God in the ordinance of baptism, Brother Kierstead decided to remain another day, have a fifth baptism and one service in the Canaan Baptist Church which had been calling him. There were six baptised at this time and twenty seekers were at the altar. The meeting was one of power and blessing and everybody seemed to enjoy it.

Pray for the people of Salem that they may continue the good work that it may not die out but rather grow, increase and spread out into other needy fields near by, which are already calling for aid.

Reports by letter were presented from St. John, Grey's Mills and Moncton Churches, also verbal reports from Mercer Settlement, Norton, Westchester and Upper Millstream. These reports were spoken to by Rev. W. W. Howe, Noah Hicks and M. Ella Slipp, urging more Home Missionary work in these rural churches. Brother Howe and Sister Foley spoke especially of the church at Westchester and the need of help there.

This Quarterly Meeting regretted very much the lack of interest taken in the Quarterly Meetings, which were of much

spiritual help when attended; no delegates from Moncton or Morton Churches.

Friday evening Brother Noah Hicks led in prayer and praise service: lesson St. John 15, a time of soul feasting and encouragement.

Saturday evening service led by Brother Geo. Rogers, who spoke from Matt. 27:22, "What shall I do with Jesus, which is called Christ?" This sermon was preached in demonstration and power, throwing out the warning with no uncertain sound, with the Holy Ghost sent down from heaven.

Sunday morning love feast led by Brother Noah Hicks, lesson Ps. 91. Preaching at 11 by Rev. W. W. Howe from I. Kings 22:14, a message to us to speak the words the Lord would have us speak. A communion service followed: a time of real soul feasting and refreshing with our Lord. At this service a silver communion set, presented to the Grey's Mills Church by the St. John Church, was used for the first time.

On Sunday afternoon Rev. M. Ella Slipp brought the message from Daniel 6:3, a sermon delivered in the freedom and power of the Holy Ghost.

At 7.30 Rev. W. W. Howe preached from 2nd Kings 5:10: theme, do what God tells us to do to the very letter, and preached with Holy Ghost power, at the close three came to the altar and prayed through to salvation.

Every service was honored by the presence of the Holy Spirit. Full salvation was surely emphasized mightily. We pray God may call more such preachers out in the great harvest fields for souls. The results were: three souls believed to be saved, many souls encouraged and strengthened. We, therefore, urge all members and ministers of all the churches in this District to awake to the fact that Quarterly Meetings are of much importance to the spiritual welfare of our churches, and to have a goodly number of delegates to attend the next quarterly meeting to be held at Lower Millstream, Dec. 4th to 7th.
