EDITORIAL.

"Let Your Light so Shine."

The sinner is in darkness and walketh in darkness, but when he co-operates with the Spirit of Christ there is imparted to him Divine light, which God permits us to call, ours, as we are then heirs of God and joint-heirs of Jesus Christ. And this "light" Jesus bids us to "let shine," and "shine" in a certain way, and for a certain purpose. Here is where we need the "wisdom from above." God may put within us the light of regeneration, but the manner of letting it shine may not attract souls, or properly represent Christ. We may have the light of full salvation, and yet our shining forth may not be helpful as it should be. We may rebuke even sin in a wrong way, or declare the truth, so it may rather hurt than help. Paul says, "**Speak the truth in love.**" I fear there is sometimes a failure, even in the preaching of full salvation, because of the way or manner it is presented. **We may even think that we are persecuted for the truth's sake, when we are only opposed, for our roughness of manner and coarseness of expression.** We not only need to have the light in us, but to so reflect or let that light shine, that others may accept it as the true light from heaven. **Oh, how we need Heavenly wisdom to win souls for Jesus!** James says, "if any lack wisdom let him ask of God and it shall be given him." But after all, our shining is not so much to save all men as it is to "glorify" God.

We may reflect our sanctified light in a proper way before men and they still hate and oppose both us and the truth. All men will not be saved from sin, though the Angel Gabriel came to earth and preached entire sanctification, as they did not accept the Holy Jesus when He spake as never man spake. But we must so manifest the light of salvation which God has given us, in holy living, suffering, meekness and patience, that men, even while they oppose us, will be compelled to admit that God has done great things for us, as shown in our daily walk and conversation; and thus glorify God. Peter says "Having your conversation honest

among the Gentiles: that, whereas they speak against you as evil-doers, they may by your good works, which they shall behold, glorify God in the day of visitation." God saves us that we may shine for His glory, whether men will accept salvation or not. He saves men through Christ, the true Light, that they may reflect the imparted Christ-life, before their fellows in such a Christ-like spirit and manner, that their fellows will be compelled to acknowledge that Christ is in them of a truth, whether their fellows personally accept or reject the truth thus represented.

God would leave all men without excuse, so that at the judgment, if not before, they will be compelled to acknowledge their condemnation just, if they reject Christ.

Brother or sister, does your light shine for God's glory? Or are you seeking your own glory? Do you reflect the light of a pure heart? God has set the lights of full salvation along the rocky and dangerous coasts of this sin-cursed world, that the regenerated voyager as well as the anxious shipwrecked sinner may be guided to the haven of glory. You may be some lonely lighthouse containing the light of Holiness, on a rocky shore, where the fierce gales of persecution blow, or the billows of slander dash at your very feet; but shine on, lone one! Shine on! Keep your lamp trimmed and burning. The greater the darkness, the more furious the tempest, the more need of your light. Then shine on. Keep the reflectors free from dust and at the right angle, and your vessel full of holy oil. Shine on! Be not discouraged. Be patient. You shine for Him. Some poor shipwrecked mariner may see your light and be saved. Some valuable merchant-man may be guided into the harbor. You may have thought your light shone out in the storm and darkness for naught; but at the great judgment morning, when the storm and rough billows of persecution and slander have ended, and the mists of misunderstanding have cleared away; you will hear the Master, who placed you there, and told you to shine, say—"**Well done good and faithful servant,**" you shone for my glory on earth and now thou shalt shine in My heavenly glory for ever.
