Purity, as in the burning bush which Moses saw, the live coal which touches Isaiah's lips, the refiner and purifier of silver of which Malachi spoke: and the cloven tongues of flame which sat upon their heads at Pentecost.

Punishment of sin. As evidenced in the burnings at Sinai; the eternal fire that destroyed Sodom, the destruction twice of "fifty and their leader" by fire at the word of Elijah. And the everlasting fire sentences are symbols of His wrath to come.

Hence, we may conclude that "Our God is a consuming fire" in that (1) The fiery burning of His love consumes sin from the heart of a trusting believer who is committed to Him for that purpose as the precious metal committed to the refiner to be purified. (2) The flaming fire, of His wrath consumes the wicked with the brightness of His coming. (3) The eternal heat of His displeasure at the sin and unbelief of those who perish is to them as a fire that is never quenched.—J. H. S.

"Any nation that dares dethrone God and spit contempt in the face of Jesus Christ can look for disaster without any considerable amount of delay. Europe is today reaping the whirlwinds of her infidelity and rationalism. America is pointed that way, having taken the Bible from before the eyes of her school children, having thrown the Sabbath open for festivity and gain, and having virtually deserted the idealism of the Christian home. The world has drifted from God, and the crash of the wreckage has startled the ears of men. America has not yet gone upon the reefs, but her directions are appalling. he is undoubtedly drifting. The anchor no longer holds the rock.

America now heads for the breakers, with the thunders of a gathering typhoon to right and left. Are you searching for the cause? Go find it in the fact that the nation has forgotten God.

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Public school education has been successfully paganized. Christian idealism must not be longer taught. The Holy Bible is not a fit book for the school room. Prayer as a part of the school program is this day impossible. Little wonder that our juvenile courts are crowded to the limits with high school girls and boys. Indeed, it would be a thing surprising if such a departure from American educational ideas and standards, as they were set up in the early hours of our public schools by the fathers, did not sire cigarette smoking, swearing and even sex-appeasing girls to be the future mothers of the nation. Wehn a high school principle in a great American city declares that 90 per cent of the girls of his school swear profanely, I am not at all astonished. Nor is the public school alone to blame. Our church schools have compromised until disaster alone is possible. We are teaching our children rationalism as deadly as the Hun ever fostered in his pre-war universities and are doing it in the name of the church. Can we hope for grapes from such thistles? When the Bible is cut to pieces before the eyes of our sons and the creative power of God belittled until it is a campus joke, can you expect those same sons to come back to us strong men of Christian faith and idealism? When dancing and theatregoing and every other form of worldly and even soul-debasing amusements are encouraged in our so-called Christian schools, there is little wonder that our children come back from them, finished "flips" and flossy "flappers" rather than men and women whom God can own and the nation depend upon. For men to be enthusiastic about everything else and passive and unaffected by their religion argues that they do not consider it of so much value as other things. There is such a thing as making the religion of Christ so dull and insipid that it appears to be a thing endured rather than enjoyed.

A religion without demonstration does not appear to the world about us. The real joy of the Lord is intended by its demonstrations to put the world under conviction. A real shout that is inspired by the Holy Spirit will convict more keenly the unsaved than thousands of dry, dead sermons. A heart broken world all about us is looking for something that will cure their sorrows or give ease of heart under burdens and trials of life and unless we can show them that we have something to be found nowhere else they will go some where else to get relief.

We have put the brakes onto our religion so much lets there be wild fire that we have extinguished the real fire.
